Back in a part which affords him all of the opportunities for characterization that "Little Caesar" gave him, Edward G. Robinson, one of the finest actors on stage or screen is now playing the stellar role in First National's "Bullets or Ballots" at the Elsinore theatre.

In this film he plays the part of a hard-boiled detective of the two-fisted school who breaks up an organization of racketeers.

The picture opens with Robinson as a former detective and head of New York's famous strong arm squad being relegated to a patrolman's beat in the Bronx.
