

## Answer Filed In Crash Case

Ritterman Alleges Fault Is  
Plaintiffs; F. Brooks  
Asks For Divorce

Dr. George Ritterman yesterday filed his answer to the action brought against him by Lulu Brown seeking damages for injuries allegedly suffered when she was struck by a car driven by Ritterman on South 12th street.

Ritterman denies negligence in the accident and states that the accident was directly caused by the contributory negligence of the plaintiff in walking on the wrong side of the road and in failing to take proper precautions when she saw the car approaching.

Complaint for divorce was filed yesterday by Frances Brooks against James Brooks. She accuses the defendant of failure to support her and of wasting his money and embarking her by failure to pay bills. The couple were married in McMinnville, October, 1925. There are no children. She asks the return of her personal belongings.

## Highway Bids to Be Eyed July 23

Undercrossing in Vicinity  
of Hubbard Is One of  
Major Projects

Bids for the construction of highways and other improvements aggregating a cost of \$500,000 will be considered at a meeting of the state highway commission to be held in Portland July 23.

One of the largest projects is the proposed undercrossing of the Southern Pacific tracks on the Butteville-Hubbard section of the Wilsonville cutoff highway. This undercrossing would be situated a mile north of Hubbard and was estimated to cost \$90,000.

The Wilsonville cutoff when completed will shorten the distance between Aurora and Portland by approximately four miles.

Grading 1.58 miles of the Wall creek-Siskiyou section of the Pacific highway in Jackson county.

Approximately .80 mile of grading on the Salt Creek-Gold Trail section of the Willamette highway in Lane county.
