

Working Hours on WPA Projects Will Be Appreciably Reduced

Hourly Wages Are Increased

Same Pay Per Month Will Prevail Under Setup as Now Arranged

Working hours for men on Willamette valley WPA projects will be reduced as much as 51.4 per cent and at least 11.2 per cent under the new wage system provided for under the 1936 works program enactment by congress, according to information district WPA officials here received yesterday from E. J. Griffith, state administrator.

Hourly rates determined by Griffith's staff as the prevailing wage rates in the county to which the worker will be assigned since last fall but the worker will receive no more money each month than he ever did. D. G. Metcalf, district labor inventory director, explained. Where the wage rate is increased, the number of working hours per month will be reduced.

45 Cents, Unskilled
Unskilled laborers on WPA projects will receive 45 cents an hour in Marion county, 44 cents in Linn county and 40 cents in Polk county. Whereas in the

past all WPA employees worked 120 hours per month, hereafter in Marion county the work month will be 106.6 hours and in Linn and Polk, 100 hours. Maximum monthly earnings will be limited to the \$48 in Marion county, \$44 in Linn and \$40 in Polk county that have prevailed since the works program began last October.

The lowest classification of skilled manual labor will be paid 75 cents an hour in the eight counties in this WPA district. Rates for advanced types of skilled labor in Marion county are set as follows:

Buildings operators, painters and shovel operators, 90 cents an hour; carpenters, shinglers, lathers, electricians, structural steel workers and plumbers, \$1; bricklayers, drapery operators and plasterers, \$1.20. Project workers classed as skilled but not engaged in manual labor will be paid 70 cents an hour.

Rates for semi-skilled occupations, 65 cents an hour in Marion and Linn counties and 60 cents in Polk county. Workers classed as professional or technical, such as teachers, artists and engineers will receive 77 cents, 69 cents and 61 cents, respectively, in these three counties.

Lane Scale Similar
Elsewhere in the three WPA districts, wages will approximate those in Marion, Polk and Linn counties. The Lane county scale in most instances follows that of Marion county; identical wage rates are provided for both Linn and Benton counties; Polk, Yamhill, Tillamook and Lincoln counties are grouped together. Metcalf said the new scales would become effective as of the first July payroll dates, which are as follows:

Marion county, July 11; Polk and Linn counties, July 3; Benton and Yamhill counties, July 5; Lincoln and Tillamook, July 13, and Lane, July 8. The aim of the new scale is to pay wages that are the average for the type of labor involved as determined separately in each county, Metcalf stated. The WPA rates were the result of a study of wages paid by cities, counties, private contractors, the federal bureau of public roads, state highway department, PWA and the organized labor scales.

Jennison Funeral Scheduled Today

Resident Here Since 1920 Has Many Friends; Was Judge in Kansas

Funeral services for John H. Jennison, 70, will be held today at 3 p. m. at the chapel of W. T. Rigdon company, Dr. W. C. Kantner and Dr. Grover C. Birchett will officiate. Concluding services will be in Belcrest Memorial park.

He was well known in this community as a Watkins dealer, having engaged in that activity for the past 15 years. Previously he followed the profession of law. He was born in Wayne county, Iowa, March 15, 1867. As a young man he worked through the southwest in a surveying crew. After several years of teaching in Kansas he studied law and was admitted to the bar in 1885 and was a member of the Kansas Bar association until coming to Oregon in 1919. For 16 consecutive years he was a judge in Barton county, Kansas.

In 1887 he was married to Alice de la Vergne. They made their home at Great Bend, Kansas, and to this union were born six children, two of whom survive him. In 1920 he came to Salem, where he has since resided.

Active in Church
He was a member of the Congregational church in Great Bend, Kansas. Since coming to Salem he has been a member of the First Congregational church of this city. He was also a member of the Marion County Christian federation and was keenly interested in politics and civic affairs. He is survived by his widow, Alice Jennison; one daughter, Mrs. Edna J. Ellis, instructor in Latin, Willamette university; one son, Rev. Earl V. Jennison, Palo Alto; a brother, David Jennison, Ringwood, Oklahoma; and two sisters, Mrs. Etta Chapman, Philomath; and Mrs. Anna Harnden, Kansas; and three grandchildren in California.

To Map Defense Of Coast Region

War plans covering the defense of the mouth of the Columbia river and the Oregon coast line will be worked out in detail during the next 15 days by Major General White, commander of the northwest national guard division, with members of his staff from four states and attached regular army and reserve officers. It was announced yesterday.

Division command post exercises will begin today, using Camp Clatsop as a base, and will include reconnaissance, mapping and preparation of defense plans from Tillamook Head north to the Columbia river. The work is an outcome of the staff work of the fourth army in preparing plans for defense of the northwest held in the vicinity of Tacoma last September.

With officers present from all parts of the United States it was found at that time that the Columbia river mouth is one of the most critical points on the Pacific coast in event of any future invasion.

Forty officers who are taking part in the Columbia river planning will come from Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana.

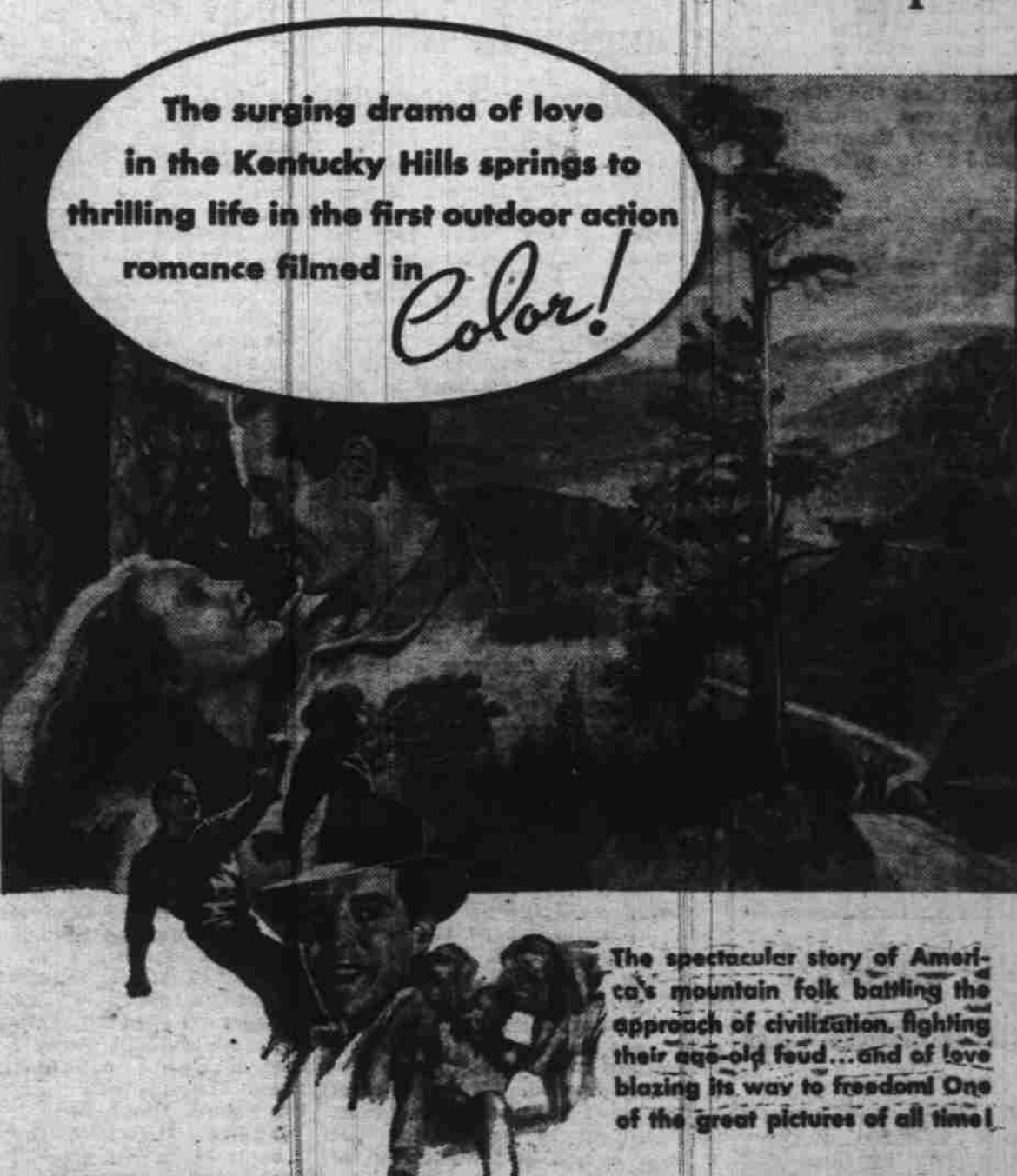
