told city officials such procedure was satisfactory if gambling was found when the warrant was issued; otherwise there might be trouble.

Reverend Telling Chief Ordinance Is Void

Kowitz at one time told Minto "he could get a warrant if he heard gamblers or saw them through a window," he said. The former city attorney, denied he had told Minto that the "barred door" ordinance was void. Minto had testified that Kowitz had told him this ordinance, represented as authorizing police to break down barred doors, "would not hold water."

Alderman Walter Fuhrer, excused from the first trial on account of illness, returned to the stand as the last defense witness, to enlarge upon a statement he had made earlier in the day. The defense excused former Mayor Douglas McKay from testifying when it developed he could not be found.

The next to the last defense witness was J. E. Tryon who denied he had ever handed an envelope to the defendant, as charged by state testimony.

Fuhrer's morning testimony brought out that Minto had reported gambling conditions to the police committee and "five or six times" had asked for additional funds.

Fuhrer did not know of the ordinance against barred doors, he testified under cross-examination, but he added, "had I known, I probably would have ordered it enforced."

Did Not Counsel Non-Enforcement

Did you people advise him that if he had evidence that there was gambling going on in the city that he shouldn't enforce the law? Moody wanted to know.

"No," was the answer.

Fuhrer denied he knew Tryon was running a gambling house, declared he had never acted as attorney for the man "in a gambling case or any other." He had visited Tryon's Pine Tree Inn south of Salem but not when Tryon was there, he declared.

Chemeketas Pick Green Lakes Site

Organizing Now For Camp Period; About 20 to Attend, Forecasts

The eighth annual encampment of the Salem Chemeketas is now being organized. The camp will be held at Green lakes which lie in the saddle between South Sister and Broken Top, two mountains with living glaciers. The lakes are reached by a short trail up Fall creek from Sparks lake and the Century drive from Bend.

Two weeks of mountain climbing, hiking, swimming, fishing and resting will be enjoyed by the party, August 9 to 23. The camp enrollment is expected to number nearly 20 though not all are remaining for the full two weeks.

Burt Cray will be the camp chef, a position he has held since the first camp at Marion lake in 1929. Other encampments of the Chemeketas have been: 1930, Scott lake; 1931, Mount Rainier; 1932, Spirit lake, Mt. St. Helens; 1933, Lost lake, Mount Hood; 1934, Wallowa mountains; 1935, Jefferson park.

The camp is open to all physically fit whether members of the Chemeketan organization or not. Arthur Boeschman is acting as organizer for the camp. C. A. Sprague is chairman of the committee. Other committeemen are William McCloud and Dr. C. A. Downs, any of whom will supply information. The registration will close August 4.

Spanish revolt, had gotten planes from Italy and Germany.

Madrid sent its third gold shipment to France, worth \$1,500,000. French newspapers, hinting they believed the first two were in payment for supplies, declared French intervention in Spain would mean a European war.

Many Else After Ambush, Slaughter

The reported slaughter of 2,000 Spanish leftists as they advanced on Zaragoza, northeastern rebel stronghold, was said to have been accompanied by the flight of 4,000 more loyalists.

The insurgents also seized Oyarzun, which they had lost only yesterday, and strengthened their position in the north.

Loyal troops were reported to have executed 19 rightist officers at San Sebastian, including General Carrasco, former military government there.

With 37 British warships held in Spanish waters, more were expected from Valetta, Malta, and reports circulated at Gibraltar that there would be a fleet concentration at that British-owned rock.

The British government prepared a strong protest against the reported seizure of British banks and factories in Spain. Some American banks also were said to have been taken over.

Farm Prices Are Highest, 6 Years

CHICAGO, July 30.—(AP)—Prices of important farm commodities soared to the highest levels in six years today as markets revised their measure of the wide sweep of drought's crop destruction in North America.

In trade markets through the world peak prices of 1936 for many farm products were posted in sudden recognition of the severity of losses in many types of feed and food stuffs.

A special government report indicating that in important producing areas half of the acreage planted to corn, the largest cash crop in the United States, was damaged beyond recovery. Electrified crops at Chicago and Kansas City and prices shot up four cents—the limit permitted in one session.

According to bureau of agricultural economics figures, damage inflicted by drought and heat in July caused the sharpest rise in farm prices that has occurred in any 30-day period since August, 1934. The general level of values, the bureau said, was lifted to the highest point since September, 1930.

F. R. Leaves Upon Train For Quebec

ST. ANDREW, N. B., July 30.—(AP)—President Roosevelt left here by train at 9 p. m. (E. S. T.) tonight for Quebec.

Several thousand citizens of the New Brunswick mainland lined the road from the dock to the president's train and cheered as he went by in his automobile.

Lieutenant Governor Murray McLaren of New Brunswick province greeted the president as he alighted from his car with his son, James, and the latter's wife.

President Roosevelt and McLaren chatted before the president loaded his train saying he hoped to be back here next year although, he said, it might be in the role of a private citizen.

Pekingese Rates Social Register

NEW YORK, July 30.—(AP)—Miss Rose Morris of New York City and Lenox, Mass., a four-year-old unpedigreed Pekingese, "came out" today in the summer edition of the Social Register of New York.

Actually, Rose's name has graced the "blue book," index of Gotham society, since its publication last spring, but not until today when a magazine and New York newspapers announced it publicly, did George Lovett Kingsland Morris, as spokesman for the family, admit Rose had made the grade.

Morris blamed it all on Mrs. Morris, granddaughter of the late Frederick T. Frelinghuysen, secretary of the state under President Chester Arthur.

"She filled out the forms for the summer register and she didn't tell me until afterward that she had put Rose in for a joke," said Morris.

Charges that he had disclosed military secrets to Japan were formally denied today by John S. Farnsworth, discharged naval officer, who pleaded innocence in the federal court here to a double-edged grand jury indictment.

Handcuffed to a deputy United States marshal, Farnsworth marched briskly into the courtroom and entered his plea in a sharp, confident voice.

Immediately after the hearing, Farnsworth called Attorney William E. Leahy to his cell to discuss plans for his defense before a jury early in October.

The indictment accused Farnsworth of delivering a secret naval booklet, "the service of information and security" to a Japanese agent in August, 1934. A warrant charged him with attempting to deliver the same publication.

Trapeze Artist Falls to Death

SALISBURY BEACH, Mass., July 30.—(AP)—A 23-year-old trapeze performer, Miss Mitzel Rellmut, of West Englewood, N. J., plunged 50 feet to her death during the final moments of her act here today.

The girl was swinging at high speed, by a strap clenched in her teeth, when she dropped. Police said the strap broke.

The girl was one of a troupe billed as the Four Albanis.

Warren Electrocut

HUNTSVILLE, Tex., July 31.—(Friday)—(AP)—Glenn Warren was put to death in the electric chair early today for the murder of Charles E. Cansler, sr., aged 24, a casket maker, in February, 1934. Warren made no statement in the death chamber.
