

Menu For Sunday Supper Outlined

Tuna Salad, Peach Butter, Caramel Pineapple Pie Combination Good

This menu serving four is suitable for a Sunday night supper or the evening meal for any warm day.

Peach Butter Recipe
Dinner Serving Three Or Four

Tuna Salad
Buttered Lima Beans
Hot Rolls
Peach Butter, Spiced Watermelon Pickles
Ripe Olives
Caramel Pineapple Pie
Coffee
Tuna Salad

2/3 cup tuna
1/2 cup diced celery
2 hard-cooked eggs, diced
1/2 cup diced cucumbers
2 tablespoons chopped sweet pickles
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1/3 cup salad dressing
Mix and chill ingredients and serve on crisp lettuce leaves. If desired, this can be used for a sandwich filling by cutting ingredients finer than for salad.

Peach Butter, Spiced
6 cups sliced peaches
5 cups sugar
3 tablespoons lemon juice
1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
2/3 teaspoon cloves
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
1/8 teaspoon salt
Mix ingredients, mash well and simmer until butter is thick. This will require about 35 minutes' cooking. Stir frequently. Pour into sterilized glasses.

Caramel Pineapple Pie
Baked pie shell
2/3 cup dark brown sugar
4 tablespoons flour
1 cup water

Crab Meat's Delicacy Makes It Ideal For Hot Weather Meals; Some Recipes Are Provided by Housewives of Salem

A good many families are enlivened at the beach these days and even those left at home may obtain fresh or canned crab readily. There is a delicacy about crab that makes it particularly suitable for hot weather meals.

Try one or more of the following ideas for serving crab. Salem housewives have contributed them.

Crab-Apple Salad
1 pkg. quick setting gelatin
1 pint mayonnaise
juice of 1 1/2 lemons
meat of 3 crabs
1 green pepper
1 can pimiento
few green olives
1 small dry onion
1 can peas if desired
Dissolve gelatin in 2 cups hot water. Let stand until it begins to set. Put pepper, pimiento, olives and onion through food chopper. Fold in nearly all mayonnaise, lemon juice and other ingredients. Add crab meat last. Fill molds about half full. When nearly set, fill remainder of molds with following tomato aspic:

1 large can tomatoes with puree
1 large onion, cooked, strained
Dissolve 1 package gelatin in usual cold water, stir into tomatoes and onion juice and fill molds

1/4 cup crushed pineapple
1/4 cup orange juice
2 egg yolks
1/8 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla
Blend sugar and flour, add water and pineapple. Add orange, yolks and salt. Cook slowly and stir constantly until filling becomes thick and creamy. Beat, add vanilla, pour into pie shell. Cover with meringue.

2 egg whites, beaten
5 tablespoons sugar
3 tablespoons pineapple
Add sugar to beaten whites and beat until creamy. Add pineapple and roughly spread over filling. Bake 10 minutes in slow oven. Cool and serve cut in wedge shaped pieces.

Deviled Crab
1/2 part crab meat
1/2 part bread crumbs
Soak bread crumbs in one cup of cream, or half milk and half cream until soft and fluffy. Add dash of nutmeg, paprika, salt, cayenne pepper to taste. Mix with crab meat. Add a teaspoon of lemon juice and lots of melted butter. Put in well buttered and sprinkle over top. Allow to bake in moderate oven for half an hour. Four crabs will serve 12 people. I serve sliced tomatoes, salted water, and coffee with this delicious recipe.

Creamed Chicken La Seafood
1 dozen fresh shrimp
1 cup sliced mushrooms
1 tablespoon green pepper
1 pint cream
1 1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon paprika
1/4 pound crab meat
2 cups diced cooked chicken
1 tablespoon chopped pimiento
1/4 teaspoon pepper
Wash shrimp and cook for 20 minutes in boiling water, shell and chop. Sauté the mushrooms and green pepper in two tablespoons butter. Make a white sauce of cream, flour and two tablespoons butter. Season and combine the chicken, shrimp, crab and other ingredients. Serve on toast.

HOPEWELL, Aug. 13.—Thomas Jefferson Harris, 62, a native son of Oregon, died at the McMinville hospital early Friday morning, following six days' illness.
