

Julia McKnight, 74, Dies at Home

Funeral Services Will Be Today For Member of Pioneer Family

ALBANY, Aug. 27.—Mrs. Julia Ann McKnight, 74, wife of D. B. McKnight, former Linn county judge, died at the family home near Sand Ridge Tuesday afternoon, August 25. Funeral services will be held from the Fortmiller Funeral home Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Burial will be in the Sand Ridge cemetery.

Mrs. McKnight was the daughter of two Oregon pioneers, David D. and Mary Mithollen, and was born in Linn county, October 15, 1861, in the vicinity of Oakville. Her parents took an active part in the organization of the Oakville United Presbyterian church and also in helping to maintain it, and Mrs. McKnight, as a girl, also took an active part in the work of this church of which she was a member her entire life.

On September 30, 1886, she was married to D. B. McKnight, who with four daughters survive. The daughters are Edna C. McKnight, who is at present in New York City; Mary Gladys and Mildred all at home. She is also survived by two sisters, Mrs. Peter Fortner and Mrs. Charles Tharp of Corvallis.

With the exception of a few years which she spent in Corvallis while attending school, Mrs. McKnight had spent her entire life in Linn county. For several years while her husband was filling the office of county judge she resided in Albany.
