Burk Case Set On Wednesday

Latourette Will Preside; Permitting Prisoner to Escape Is Charge

Trial of Sheriff A. C. Burk on charges of permitting a prisoner to escape is scheduled to get started in department No. 1 of the circuit court Wednesday morning, with Judge E. C. Latourette of Oregon City presiding. Joseph Hammerley of Portland is to be special prosecutor for the state.

This is one of a second pair of indictments that Burk has faced on similar charges. The first indictments were thrown out by Judge Fred S. Wilson of The Dalles.

On the other side of the court Judge L. C. Lewelling is scheduled to hear testimony in the injunction suit of Savage and Fox against the milk control board. This case is also scheduled for Wednesday.

The plaintiffs are seeking an injunction to prevent the control board from enforcing a basic allotment ruling for the Salem milk shed and to prevent the collection of fees for surplus milk produced under the allotment.

Monday Judge Lewelling is scheduled to hear the mortgage foreclosure case of the Union Central Life Insurance company vs. Milroy.

Tuesday Judge Lewelling will hold his regular motion day.
