ganization" prevailed in Madrid. Generalissimo Fanroo, himself, threatened to "punish" nations which receive Bank of Spain gold from the Madrid government, declaring he would refuse to sign economic agreements with them.



Alberta Scrip to **Face Court Test**

EDMONTON, Alta., Oct. 15.-(Canadian Press)-The city of Edmonton and the Alberta government faced the possibility today of further litigation in their desire to come to an agreement over provincial scrip money.

R. H. Watson, Edmonton mining engineer, ifled a court notice today he would seek an injunction restraining the city from accepting scrip in payment of util-ities' services as authorized by the city council Tuesday. The notice indicated it would be heard here October 23.

It was watson who upset by court action an agreement between Edmonton and the provincial government under which the city undertook to take scrip in lieu of cash relief money. Edmonton's relief grant for August \$55,000 was to be exchanged for scrip to that value and \$30,000 extra scrip donated. The city agreed to circulate the \$30,000 for two years with holders obligated to affix a one-cent stamp each week.
