Approximately 5000 names of Salem residents are on the mailing list to which Mrs. Hendricks' committee will submit seals, the proceeds from which will be used in preventive work against tuberculosis. A large share of the funds will be retained in Marion county, and will be used partly to apply on salaries of nurses and doctors in the health department in connection with their anti-tuberculosis work, and partly for free x-rays for Marion county residents who are unable to pay for such service.
