ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the Secretary, State Capitol Reconstruction Commission, 714 Porter Building, Portland, Oregon until 12 o'clock noon November 20, 1936, for the erection and completion of the Oregon State Capitol Building, in the city of Salem, Marion County, State of Oregon.

These proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud at 2 o'clock P. M., on said date at Room "A" of the Public Library—801 S. W. 10th Street, Portland, Oregon.

The work will consist of: The furnishing of all labor and material required for the erection and completion of the building and general construction work including heating and ventilating systems, electric wiring and fixtures, plumbing work, including fire, fire lines, sprinkler systems, elevators, etc., and all incidental work in connection therewith.

Plans, specifications, and other contract documents are on file for examination at the office of Whithouse & Church, Railway Exchange Building, Portland, Oregon. Copies of these documents may be obtained upon application to the deposit of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars per set with said Whithouse & Church. The deposit will be refunded upon the return in good condition of said documents.

No proposal will be considered unless it follows a form of proposal furnished by said State Capitol Reconstruction Commission. Attention is called to the pre-qualification requirements of Chapter 225, Laws of Oregon, 1931.

The work is to be paid for in whole or in part out of funds furnished by the United States Government and all work and materials must be performed and/or furnished in accordance with the rules and regulations prescribed by the President and the rules and regulations relating to applicants and projects under the Emergency Appropriation Act of 1935.

Attention is called to the fact that employees on this work must be paid not less than the minimum hourly rates of wages set out in the Federal Construction Regulations. These minimum rates for skilled labor will be \$8.55; for semi-skilled or intermediate classes of labor \$6.55; and for unskilled labor \$4.45.

Bidder's proposal must be accompanied by certified check or a bidder's bond in an amount equal to 5% of total amount of the proposal as a guarantee for the completion of the contract and the furnishing of the required bonds in case the contract is awarded to the bidder.

Acceptance of the proposal or proposals and the awarding of the contract or contracts is conditioned upon satisfactory assurance that the State Capitol Reconstruction Commission, Portland, Oregon, will be able to secure from the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works the aid necessary to finance the project.

The State Capitol Reconstruction Commission reserves the right to hold bids for a period of thirty (30) days from the date of the opening thereof.

The United States Employment Service has designated an agency at Salem, Oregon, to furnish labor lists for this work.

Remaining the same men as members of the county budget board, the county court yesterday set Saturday morning as the time for the first budget meeting. Ray Glat, Woodburn, E. L. Weider, Salem, and A. A. Ulvin, Silverton, were the reappointed members.

In giving consideration to a request made by Henry Zorn, president of the Marion county taxpayers league, that there be a change in the budget board members, Commissioner Melson pointed out that last year's members had experience in the county business and that it would be better for anyone to pick the matter up easily.

Melson said that he would be satisfied with any sound-headed business men for the committee places.

Two Accept Task. "I was well satisfied with the work of the board members last year, though I didn't have much to do with it," Judge Siegmund said. Judge Siegmund was recovering from injuries received in an automobile accident when the board met last year. A. A. Ulvin was selected as a board member by Circuit Judge L. H. McMahan who acted as county judge during Siegmund's absence.

As Zorn had made no suggestions for new members for the board, the commissioner, reappointed all of the former members subject to their being able to serve. Last night Ray Glat had not been reached. The other two gave assent to their selection.

The second and final budget meeting will be held December 1.

State Bond Debt Greatly Reduced

Oregon's bonded debt which reached its peak of \$63,608,119 in 1928, has been reduced approximately \$14,500,000, Governor Martin announced at a press conference Thursday.

The state's bonded debt now totals \$49,108,119 of which \$2,000,000 includes state veterans state aid bonds.

"I am happy at the excellent financial showing being made in this state," Governor Martin said. "We are riding high, wide and handsome economically in the midst of debt ridden states."

Governor Martin said Oregon's bonds were being retired promptly upon maturity.
