

Friesen Is Mayor For West Salem

City Council Grants Use of Old Hall to 4-H Club Members

WEST SALEM, Nov. 5.—John Friesen was elected mayor at the city election here Tuesday and R. E. Pattison, city recorder, Rebecca Best will probably become treasurer as Maud Miller has resigned the office. Councilmen are James Mitchell, George Lamire, John Douglas, Don Kuhn and Warren Baker.

The West Salem council met Monday night in the council chambers of the municipal building. W. L. LaDuo reported that 250 feet of new sewer had been laid on Franklin street; also that another extension of sewer is needed on Ruge street between Rosemont and Kingwood.

Beer License Dropped
The proposition of granting a license for a beer shop was dropped as the applicant for the license was unable to attain a building.

The committee was instructed to use its own judgment in letting different parties use the new city hall.

A budget session followed. A few minor changes were made in the budget, then it was given three readings and adopted.

Ordinance 163 governing the duties of recorder was introduced and passed over the veto of the mayor.

Floyd White of the American Legion asked for the use of the old city hall for the 4-H club members of whom Emory Sharp is instructor and such use was granted. The children are to be responsible for any damage done to the building.
