Effective Here program, according to County Agent Harry L. Riches, who has just received word that the state program has been approved. These rates and practices have

been approved for Oregon:

The following practices and rates of payment have been approved for Oregon:

1. Contouring: A payment of 60 cents for each acre furrowed on the contour.
2. Water developments: Developing of (a) Springs and sceps, \$50.00.
(b) Earth and pits or reservoirs for in-pounding precipitation, 15 cents per cubic yard of fill or excavation.

5. Fire guard, 8 cents per one-hundred linear feet.

6. Rodent control, 15 cents an infested acre for pocket gopher control.

7. Re-needing depleted range land:

(a) \$2.50 an acre for re-needing with created wheat grass.

(b) \$1.25 an acre for re-needing with alender wheat grass, western wheat grass or Bromp grass.

Grasses recommended for re-needing depleted ranges are very limited and are not the one recommended for this section of the state. Recommended varieties for this area are being forwarded to Washington and it is hoped that certain other grasses and possicertain other grasses and possi-bly mixtures of the legumes and grasses may be approved for areas where the grasses listed above are not adapted to the climate and

Any person who owns or operates any range land, except goverates any range land, except government land or public domain land, devoted to the production of livestock is eligible to make application for payment for the practices, providing the work was or is to be carried out between September 9 and December 15, 1936.

Inspection Provided
Additional facilities have been provided for the administration of this program and U. S. forest service range examiners, assigned to the work by the AAA, will make inspection of lands covered by applications for the purpose f making recommendations and determining the grazing capacity. The recommendations made by the range examiners will be approved by the county agricultural onservation committee in accordance with approved range management for the state.
