

High Official of Lions Talks Here

The 1938 Lions International convention may be held in the Pacific northwest, David Skeon, international director from Salt Lake city, told members of the Salem club at their noon luncheon yesterday. Lions clubs in Oregon are preparing to make a bid

for that convention. It would be the first ever held in this part of the country. Defining the chief purpose of the Lions club membership as "an opportunity of expressing interest in community problems," Skeon asked the Salem men if they were waiting for an accident to occur before they got behind the proposal to install traffic-control signals. He mentioned the signals, he said, not by way of criticism, but of suggestion.

Mr. Skeon, who came to the Willamette valley to attend the charter night banquet of the new club at Dallas Wednesday night, was introduced here by Judge George Rosman, law school classmate.

The director's talk was pre-ceeded by a skit in connection with national book week presented by a group of young men and women dressed as characters from well known books.

Emil Sandau was in the county jail last night after failing to furnish \$150 bail set by Judge M. E. Hayden in justice court on a non-support charge. He pleaded not guilty to the charge and is to have a preliminary hearing today at 10 o'clock.

Sandau's troubles were not confined to the one court. Suit for divorce was filed against him in circuit court by Amelia Sandau. He is charged with cruel and inhuman treatment.

They were married October 9, 1936. The plaintiff asks \$20 a month support money for two minor children aged seven and nine.

Employer Cards Come in Rapidly

Approximately 600 of the 1200 employers' registration cards under the social security act which were distributed Monday by the postoffice department have been returned. Postmaster H. R. Crawford said yesterday. He urged all employers who are intending to return the cards to the local office to do so immediately. Saturday is the last day a which they may be deposited here. After that date the cards will have to be forwarded direct to the Social Security board.

Tuesday the mail carriers will start delivering the employe registration cards to the workers whose employers have returned their registration cards.

The employe cards must be filled in and returned to the postoffice in order to receive a registration number under the security act. Clerks at the postoffice have been instructed in filling out the cards, and will be available to answer questions on the application cards. Crawford announced.

County Road Map Nearly Complete

A new county road map, developed as a WPA project, upon which Gordon Tower has been working for almost a year is expected to be completed by January 1. The new map which will show every road in the county will give the county court a complete visual record of its highways for the first time.

On the map the roads are to be designated by the range in which they lie. The county covers five ranges. The roads will be numbered by the hundred from 400 to 900. The first proof sheets of the map indicate that it will be an aid to the court in dedicating future roads and in indicating to road crews where repairs shall be made. The use of the map will alleviate the necessity of cumbersome legal descriptions.

Maps were received by the court yesterday from J. E. Smith, district WPA director, showing the location of WPA projects underway in the state at the present time. The maps cover all of the numerous projects which have been undertaken by the federal relief organization.

Changes Proposed In Fishing Season

ASTORIA, Ore., Nov. 19.—(AP)—A move to make the Columbia river fishing season more elastic came to light today with the announcement of State Senator Frank Franciscovich that he was calling a meeting of all interested parties here December 2.

Complaints have been voiced recently that open dates set by joint legislative action in Oregon and Washington did not conform closely enough with the usual runs of fish and as a result fishermen were incurring severe economic losses.

Franciscovich said he was willing to sponsor a legislative measure in Oregon seeking a change in the open season dates. E. N. Brennan, director of the bureau of fisheries for the state of Washington, was invited to attend, the senator said.
