

Property Levy Much Reduced

State Cuts Direct Taxes Through Increase in Income Receipts

and installment of outlay for the new capitol of \$458,333 which, with a similar levy to be made in 1937, will complete the state's contribution of \$1,350,000 for construction of the new capitol structure when used in conjunction with WPA funds. The capitol is the centerpiece of the various state institutions while in some cases higher than in last year's levy, are not greatly increased. There also are included the customary appropriations for the battleship Oregon, Champe's Memorial park, child welfare commission, Grand Army of the Republic, historical society, humane society, Spanish war veterans and state welfare commission.

Planning Boards!

Newer activities contained in the levy are the property control division, health mobile laboratories and state planning board. The emergency board was listed an appropriation of \$125,000 while claims were estimated at \$10,000. Fairs which are partly supported by dog and horse receipts will continue to receive the customary one-twentieth of a mill or a little more than \$44,000.

The state relief committee is provided for to the tune of almost \$1,200,000 for assistance to the aged. An additional \$33,000 is provided for assistance for the blind. The remainder of the money required for relief comes from an estimated \$2,000,000 a year profits of the state liquor commission. These levies were based on the present age limit of 70 years.

Tax commissioners said the region of the state budget office in holding down the appropriations for the next biennium within the governor's estimates, had made it possible to keep the estimated expenditures within the available revenues.

State Out of Red After Eleven Years

"The state, for the first time in 11 years, is now out of the red and will have a balance after applying income and miscellaneous receipts of \$47,540.79, not including slight anticipated revenues in 1937," the tax commission said.

Total appropriations for 1937 financed by taxes and miscellaneous revenues were estimated in the tax levy as \$7,026,242.39. The revenues from income taxes alone were estimated at \$4,000,000, an increase of \$500,000 over the estimate for the preceding year.

Receipts from miscellaneous sources were fixed at \$2,050,000. Included in the latter item are corporation department fees of \$275,000, gift taxes \$225,000, inheritance taxes \$250,000 and insurance fees \$700,000. Tithing fees also are included in the miscellaneous items. Credits and unexpended balances of appropriations for the present biennium, will revert to the general fund December 31, were estimated at \$350,000.

Revenue Sufficient To Restore Salaries

Officials estimated there would be sufficient revenue to restore salaries of state employees and meet the operating costs of the state. There is no provision, however, for capital outlays for state buildings except the state capitol which was authorized by the last legislature.

"If the legislature exceeds the budget for the ordinary expenditures of the state or enters into a building program or reduces the old age limit to 65 years, it must find new sources of revenue."

Coastwise Accord Sought Meanwhile and Alaska Shipping Arranged

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 28.—(AP)—Peace efforts went forward in two directions on the maritime strike front today on the heels of government completion of plans to man Alaska-bound emergency ships.

Operators and union representatives met to consider a final move toward bringing peace in the coastwise shipping trade.

Assistant Secretary of Labor Edward F. McGrady announced he would present immediately a new general peace proposal calling for the use of labor department representatives to serve permanently as arbitrators of day-to-day disputes between ship owners and unions.

The masters, mates and pilots union signed a contract to permit manning of the Alaska ships, thereby completing negotiations between the government and the strikers for resuming service to the northern territory.

Work of Preparing Vessel Is Started

In Washington Interior Secretary Ickes said the 800-ton government ship Boxer would leave Seattle about November 30 with the first emergency supplies for Alaska. The territory has been without service since the strike started October 30.

Striking New York seamen hailed a victory when signing of agreements with two shipping companies operating three vessels.

The coastwise peace meeting, involving operators of about 70 steam schooners and representatives of the masters, mates and pilots union, was short lived and progress had been made, it was indicated, however, the meetings might be resumed next week.

Tentative agreements previously had been reached between the schooner operators and five other unions. An accord with the masters, mates and pilots would put the opposing sides into position to conclude a formal peace.
