Edna Eastham and James Madison Brown were married at a double wedding, the other couple being Mr. and Mrs. Jake McClaine, associated with the early financial history of Silvertown.

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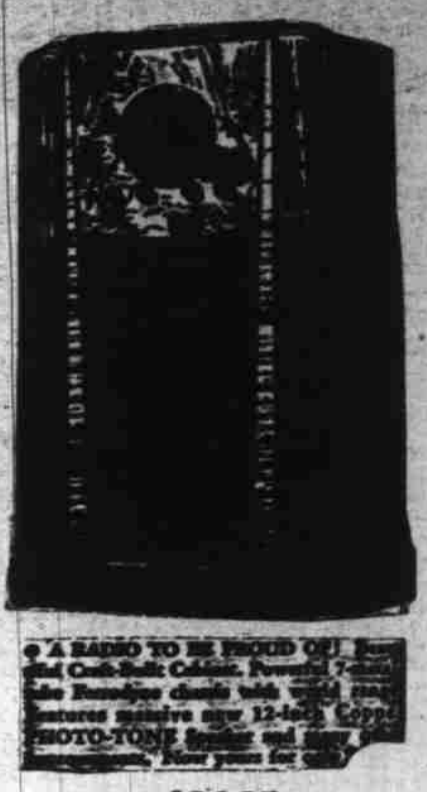
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
