

\$22,000 Bond Issue Needed

Linfield College Quartet

INDEPENDENCE, Dec. 4.—The Linfield college quartet from McMinnville entertained the Women's club members Tuesday afternoon at the clubhouse.

Tells School Plans
Dr. George C. Knott, member of the Independence school board, told of plans to modernize the local high school, which involves an election December 14 to approve a bond issue of \$22,000.

He stated the plans included a new roof, remodeling completely the present plant, a new heating system that would heat both the school and the gymnasium, construction of an auditorium on the south side of the present building which would seat 500 people and also provision for several reviewing the building.

He stated unless something was done for the high school soon, it would be a "sub-standard" school. Under the present plan for the debt load, Dr. Knott stated the tax levy would not be noticed to any extent; it would be 75 cents on a \$1000 valuation. Dr. Knott explained if the bond issue failed and the school lost its standard rating, that at present 86 students from non-high school districts would go elsewhere to school, which would mean about \$5000 a year, a sum that would pay the bond issue off in five years.
