Grain Prices Are Boosted Locally

Dollar wheat for the farmer is virtually in sight on the local markets, with 97 cents quoted to the grower yesterday for white wheat and a cent under that for red.

Oats and barley prices were quoted up a dollar a ton locally yesterday, with \$28 offered for milling oats and \$22 for feed oats. Brewing barley climbed to \$41 per ton and feed barley was quoted at \$31.

Hay prices were boosted locally also, with alfalfa bringing the farmer \$12 a ton and oats and vetch and clover each carrying \$10 per ton.

PORTLAND, Dec. 7.—(AP)—Grains drove forward sharply the past week, bolstered by a firm wheat market, the U. S. bureau of agricultural economics said today.

Rye advanced 5 cents a bushel, corn was up 2 to 3 cents, oats 2 cents and barley 3 cents. Flax also strengthened.

The report said labor difficulties continued to restrict business.

Latest chapter in the turbulent career of Leon Trotsky, radical leader and author, thrusts him into an international drama involving Russia and Norway. Recent disclosures of a plot against Stalin, Soviet dictator, linked Trotsky with the affair and resulted in a protest from Russia to Norway against the latter country's action in harboring Trotsky. The latter is now a virtual prisoner, living on a farm in the interior, and faced with the necessity of finding a new haven by Dec. 18 when his permit to reside in Norway expires.
