The supply spring and reservoir are about two miles west of Turner in the hills. Usually by early fall water is low, but owing to this season's drought, the situation has become acute. There are a number of private water systems in town. The city system has been unsatisfactory, especially of later years. Turner has petitioned to get its water supply from the Santiam, which water is to be piped to Salem, with water pipes laid close to town.
