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## Slide Averted In Unique Way

### \$30,000 Artificial Pack of Ice Stops Threat, Grand Coulee Dam

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12—Application to Mother Earth by government engineers of the freezing technique of surgeons was credited by the Interior Department with saving more than \$100,000 in the cost of laying foundations for the Grand Coulee dam on the Columbia river.

Confronted with a critical emergency, in the form of a 200,000-cubic yard slide of earth, the engineers achieved an unprecedented solution of their problem by putting a giant \$30,000 artificial ice pack on the moving, pulverized earth and freezing it into immobility.

This successful and unique performance was disclosed in a report by John C. Page, acting commissioner of reclamation, to Harold L. Ickes, secretary of the interior. The remarkable dam of frozen earth, he said, enabled the bureau to have concrete poured on schedule in the east excavation of the Grand Coulee dam, the largest dam in the world.

The foundation for the Grand Coulee dam, the principal structure of the Columbia Basin Federal reclamation project, is of exceptionally fine massive granite. During the Glacial Age, this rock was overlaid with a layer 500 feet deep of pulverized earth. The earth is comparatively stable and impervious when dry and undisturbed, but when moistened or disturbed, either by excavation or by the cutting action of the river, its stability is destroyed and it flows like molten lava.

Since excavation started at the Grand Coulee dam, several large flows have encroached upon the site. Some of them were stopped by draining the excess water, others by removing part of the overburden. The flow in the east excavation, however, began at a critical period when the earth was being removed from a great gulch in the bedrock of that section. The gulch was about 120 feet deep than the average bedrock surface and 175 feet below the low water surface of the river. It paralleled the river and apparently was cut in some past age by the stream. Its sides were very nearly vertical, being from 60 to 100 feet apart. When this gulch had been nearly emptied of earth, the great bank of clay above it began to slide into it from the upstream end. It moved about two feet an hour. The power shovels at work could not hold their own and had to retreat to avoid being buried.

The slide threatened to increase greatly the amount of excavation necessary since more than 200,000 cubic yards were in motion. Also it threatened to delay the contractor by several weeks. Draining this sliding material was not feasible and a new method of controlling it was essential.

**Experiment Unique**—Engineers in charge at the dam decided upon an experiment in which the earth at the top of the slide would be frozen and thus

strengthened to hold back the remainder of the material until the concrete had been poured to an elevation higher than that of the sliding material.

Two refrigeration machines were bought second-hand. They have a total capacity of more than 60 tons of ice. About six miles of pipe was driven into the sliding mass in the form of an arch at the head of the gulch. Brine was forced through these pipes at a low temperature and the earth frozen. The dam thus created has a crest length of 105 feet. It is 25 feet thick and 40 feet high. The major test was placed on this unique structure when the earth had been removed from in front of it. The surface of the foundation rock was smoothed by blasting. Even this did not damage the frozen dam. Flying rocks cut a few pipes in the exposed face of this structure, but repairs were made quickly and it did not fail.

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## Tax Sales Are Under Attack

### Alleged Irregularities in Proceedings by County Are Cited in Suit

Allegations that the tax foreclosure proceedings under which the county court has sold hundreds of pieces of property for delinquent taxes were made in a reply filed in circuit court yesterday by Oscar Hayter, Dallas attorney, representing the plaintiff in the case of Oril A. Edwards, administrator of the estate of Orpha Palmer Dawes, against Lulu Humphrey and Jesse Potter. The plaintiff is asking foreclosure of a mortgage of real estate.

Specific charges which were cited as making the sales void as illegal improper charges for advertising the summons which were made on a first charge rather than on the basis of the number of lines used in the description; that the publication ran for five times when four was all that was necessary; and that the county court paid no fixed amount for the property it had to take over.

The sheriff also accused of failing to make the proper sale as provided by law, in that he did not offer for sale a less quantity of the property than the whole upon which the taxes were delinquent. The property upon which the action is specifically concerned was sold to Lulu Humphrey, a sister of Jesse Potter, the mortgagor. It is alleged that the defendant Humphrey acted as trustee for Jesse Potter in buying the land from the county. The reply sets out that the mortgagor had agreed to pay the taxes on the land but failed to do so for all years except one-half of 1931. A tender of \$138 to the county for the amount the county paid for the land is made in the reply and \$637 for the amount paid by Lulu Humphrey.
