Tax Lien Issue Is Raised Here

Hewlett Held Real Buyer Contrary to Statute Barring Officers

The question of a county officer acquiring title to tax lien was raised yesterday in plaintiff's reply to defendant's answer and cross-complaint in the circuit court case of W. J. and Marie Williams vs. William Powell, Leroy and Jane Doe Hewlett. The reply accompanied a motion to permit filing of the answer after the usual time had expired.

The reply contends that Hewlett, county commissioner, paid \$240 in taxes and took a county quit claim deed for Salem property in the name of William Powell. Mrs. Hewlett's father, allegedly without Powell having knowledge of the property involved. The reply charges Hewlett took the property in the name of Powell to circumvent the statute which prohibits a county officer from acquiring title to real estate.

Hewlett has maintained the property was obtained as a home-stand for his father-in-law, who was to move here from Indiana soon.

Disease Increase Shown in Report

Measles, Diphtheria Case Visits Chief Gainers Bureau Reveals

With the exception of scarlet fever, cases of communicable diseases increased in 1936 in Marion county the annual activity reports of the Marion county bureau of health shows.

Field visits for diphtheria cases increased from seven in 1935 to 64 in 1936 while visits to typhoid sufferers increased from 78 to 144. Biggest increase in visits was for measles cases where 244 visits were made as compared with 61 in 1935. Visits for scarlet fever totaled 697 and for whooping cough 105.

No particular reason for the increase in disease was given by the health bureau except that in some years epidemic conditions run higher than in others.

Immunizations totalling 1090 were given by the health office, 404 to diphtheria patients under five years and 686 to diphtheria patients over five years old.

The department examined 4467 school children during the year and in the pre-school department 10,300 children. Tuberculin tests were given to 2190, a decrease over the two previous years, and of this number 246 showed positive reactions, also a decrease. Only nine new cases were hospitalized during the year, a decrease of 10 from 1935. Field visits totalled 268 and clinical visits 270 in this department.

In the division of venereal disease control there were 1860 clinical visits during the year, 1000 made at field clinics and eight new cases under field supervision. Physicians were supplied with 51 treatment units during the year.
