Mayor Carson of Portland Lauds Hubbard's Example in Paying Debt; 400 Folks at Celebration Banquet

HUBBARD, Jan. 21—The town of Hubbard celebrated the paying off of the last bond of the city's indebtedness Wednesday night in the Hubbard high school gym, with 400 persons enjoying the celebration banquet.

The town orchestra played several musical numbers and Mayor Garfield Voget, Hubbard, made a welcoming speech after which America was sung and prayer was given by Rev. N. E. Hank, C. Smith of St. Paul sang two numbers after which the Turkey dinner was served, in charge of the Federated church guild.

After the dinner Mayor Voget gave a brief history of the founding of Hubbard by J. T. Hubbard 30 years ago and the development of the city, then introduced Joseph Carson, mayor of Portland, who gave the main address.

Mayor Carson stated that he hoped other cities of Oregon, including Portland, would follow the example of Hubbard, that is, don't give up until the job is done. Others speakers were R. S. Brison of Eugene, who is a representative of the League of Oregon Cities; W. S. Walton and George Riches of Ladd & Bush bank;
