

WPA Worker Dies By Inhaling Gas

Leaves Note Saying Money
Needed at Once; Is
Case of Suicide

Glenn T. Griswold, 50-year old WPA worker, took his own life some time early yesterday morning by inhaling the fumes from a small gas heater in his basement apartment at 330 South 14th street.

Griswold's body was discovered about 7:30 o'clock yesterday morning by Charles G. Henderson, who owns the apartment and had given Griswold the room as payment for tending the furnace. Griswold, who was heard moving about as late as midnight, had dragged his cot close to the heater and turned on the gas.

Notes were found in the apartment in which Griswold had written repeatedly, "I must have \$25 at once. My life depends upon it."

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Augusta Griswold, 333 North 25th street, and a daughter, Mrs. Lorene West, 2054 North Capitol.

Scio Contributes \$105 to Flood Aid

SCIO, Feb. 5.—The sum of \$105.20 was sent in from Scio by P. H. MacDonald for the use of the Red Cross in alleviating flood suffering in the Ohio and Mississippi valleys. MacDonald stated that further but limited contributions were expected.

The condition of Arthur Ricketts, 18, Rodgers mountain youth who was accidentally shot over the left eye Saturday afternoon while holding a 22 rifle, is reported as unchanged in an Albany hospital. He has been rational at all times since the accident.

The bullet divided into four parts upon striking the skull and portions lodged in the brain. He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. W. W. Ricketts, who reside on the Ed Fleming land on the mountain. Owing to soft earth road and snow, barring auto traffic, it was necessary to construct a sled and remove the injured youth with a team of horses, reaching a Scio physician's office after dark on the day of the accident.

Annual Report on Schools Released

Inequality as between counties in revenues for support of the public schools, was stressed by Charles A. Howard, superintendent of public instruction, in his annual report filed Friday with Governor Martin.

The report, copies of which were also distributed among the legislators, said some counties had more than enough funds for their schools while others have been compelled to curtail their operations to keep within their revenues.

The Fletcher-Harrison bill in congress was mentioned as a possible means of averaging the costs of schooling among the various counties. A maximum fund of \$300,000,000 under this act would be apportioned throughout the United States on the basis of population.

Figures on the pupil-teacher ratio in the schools showed 21.7 pupils in grade and high schools in Oregon for every teacher during the school year 1935-36.

During the years 1932 to 1934 the number of teachers was smaller with almost 30 pupils per teacher in 1933-34.

Spring Opening Plans Launched By Ad Club; Definite Date Not Set

SCIO, Feb. 5.—Fresh tracks of a lynx, or bob cat, near the Rockwell farm in the Burgen Hollow locality southeast of Scio, prompted farmers in the vicinity to start a drive Thursday for the marauding feline. Trail hounds were enlisted in the effort to get the cat in the open but to no avail. Inclement weather and deep snow in the foothills are believed to have driven predatory animals to the settlements in quest of subsistence.

Letter Carriers Praised, Service

Salem's city and rural mail service was virtually back to normal yesterday as far as deliveries were concerned and largely so through the strenuous efforts of the carriers. Postmaster E. R. Crawford announced in the afternoon. Mail train delays caused by southern Oregon storms, however, were upsetting postoffice letter handling schedules.

Declaring that the public owed gratitude to the mail carriers, Crawford said that "few people probably realize what the city and rural carriers have gone through." The average city residential carrier walks 10 miles a day and the rural delivermen travel an average of 63 miles a day.

"They have gone through without a grumble," Crawford said of his carriers, "and they certainly deserve a lot of credit. The speed with which service has been restored has been due to the carriers' hard work, aided by citizens who clear snow from walks and by county crews who helped make roads passable."

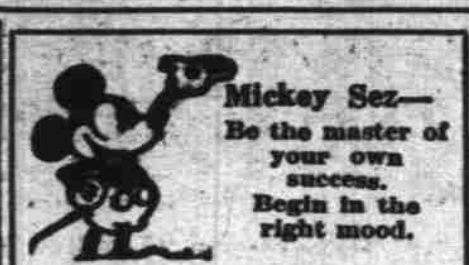
Fred Dose, Formerly Commission Merchant At Woodburn, Called

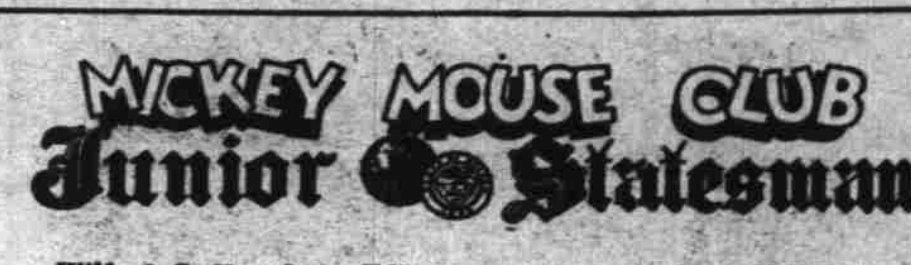

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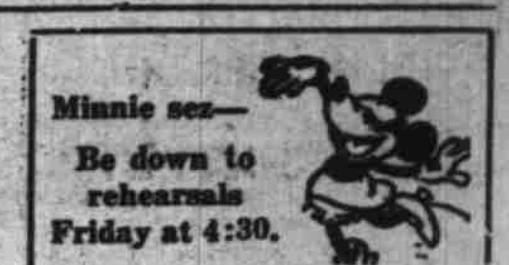
