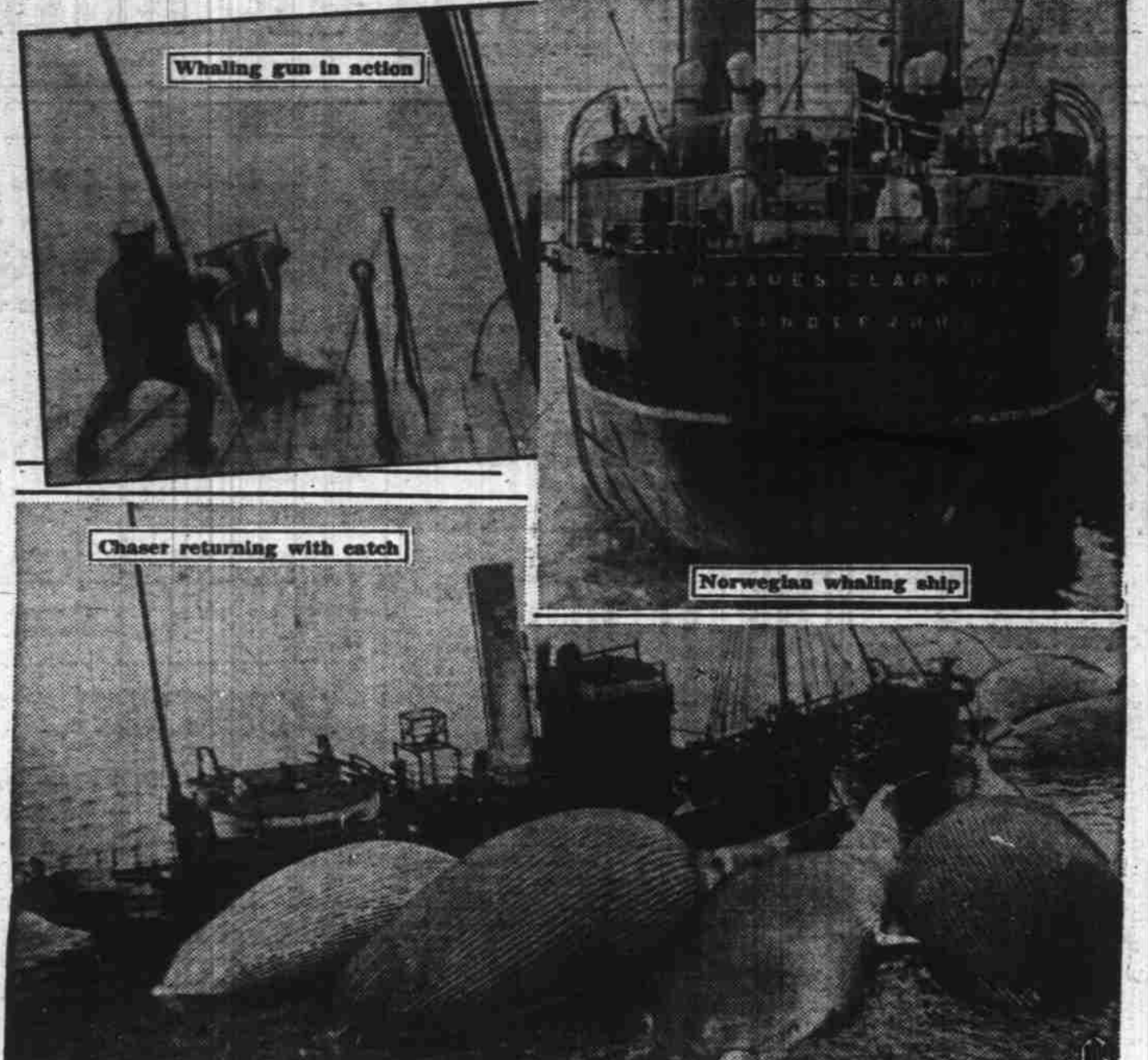
Health Leaders to Talk at Missionary Society Gathering on Thursday

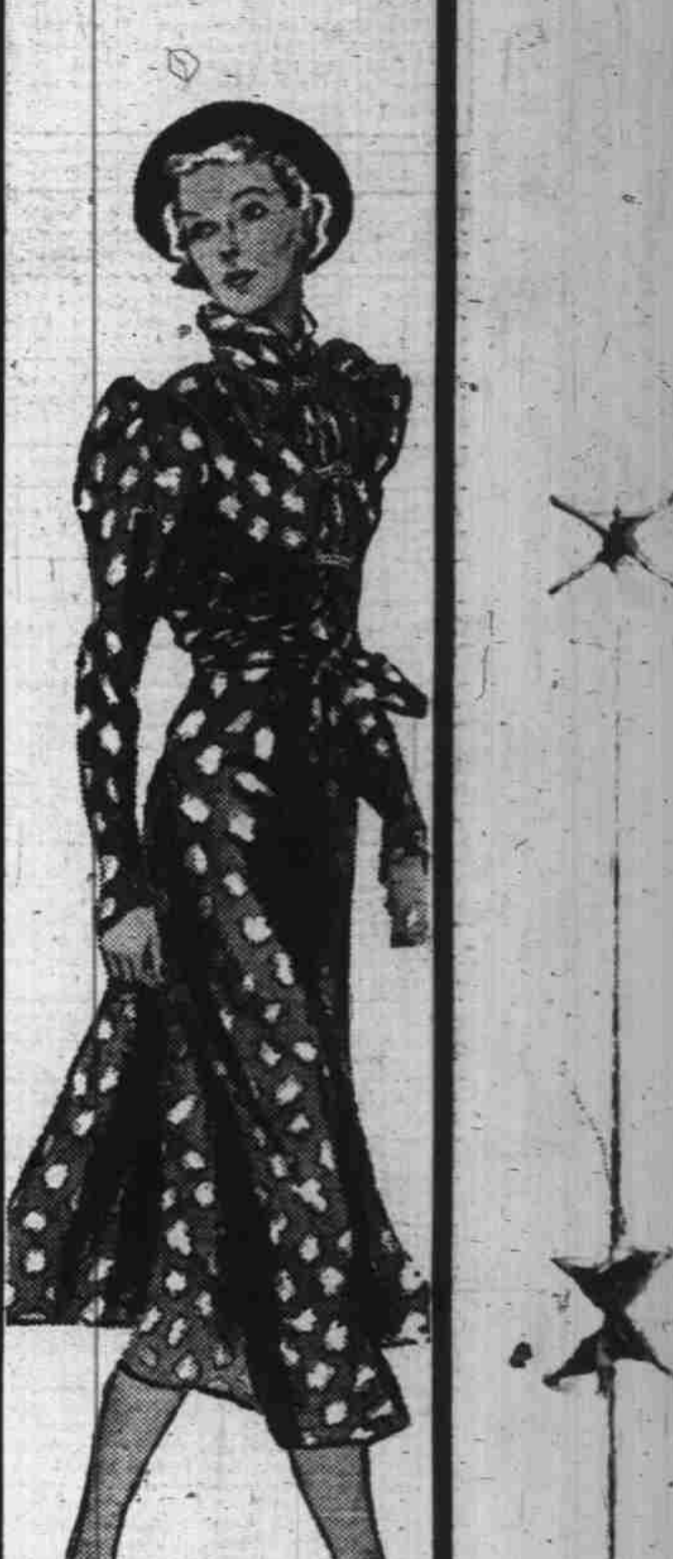
