

Fishing for whales is now done sy motorized fleets, but its romance and thrills live sn. Some 7,500 men are whaling this season, which is now at its height. Great blue whales, often more than 100 feet in length and weighing a

ton a foot, are the quarry of the hardy fishermen who each year embark from Scandinavian ports for Antarctic waters. When the whale is finally killed by the harpoon gun, the huge body is in-flated so it will not sink and towed back to the base ship where the carcass is cut up and thrown into boiling vats to extract the oil. The season extends from December to April.


