

Allen Chosen For Position at L.S.U.

Will Teach in Industrial Education Department at Baton Rouge

MONMOUTH, March 13.—Alfred T. Allen, instructor in industrial arts and sciences at Monmouth high school the past six years, was elected this week to the staff of University of Louisiana, department of industrial education, at Baton Rouge. He will teach technical and professional courses.

Allen holds degrees from Oregon State college in industrial arts and education and is a member of Kappa Delta Pi, national honorary fraternity in education, and Epsilon Tau, national honorary in industrial arts. He served as a member of the committee which developed the new industrial arts study course for Oregon. In 1935 he was president of the vocational section of Oregon State Teachers' association, and has been active in other professional organizations. He is author of many magazine articles dealing with industrial education, and individual instruction sheets for classroom use.

In 1931 he was added to the staff at Monmouth high school to introduce industrial arts. Starting from a meagre beginning, he has developed the department to a position of recognized leadership in the state.

Johnson to Quit Stationery Store

MONMOUTH, March 13.—P. H. Johnson, long time merchant of Monmouth, has announced that he will sell his stock of stationery, books and variety goods, and probably will retire from active business. He came here from Michigan some 36 years ago, opened a meat market, later operated a book and variety store, also fountain service, and for some years had a furniture agency. He has built and sold several houses here. Reports that his store building has been leased for five years to the Skaggs Safeway stores.

Johnson recently offered the city of Monmouth a block of land 165 x 720 feet lying west of the Oregon Normal school campus in exchange for sewer assessments totaling \$1100. The land would be debt free and taxes paid up. This land, formerly part of the Cummins farm tract, has long been considered a desirable addition to the Oregon Normal school's campus, and was at one time an objective for purchase by the alumni association.

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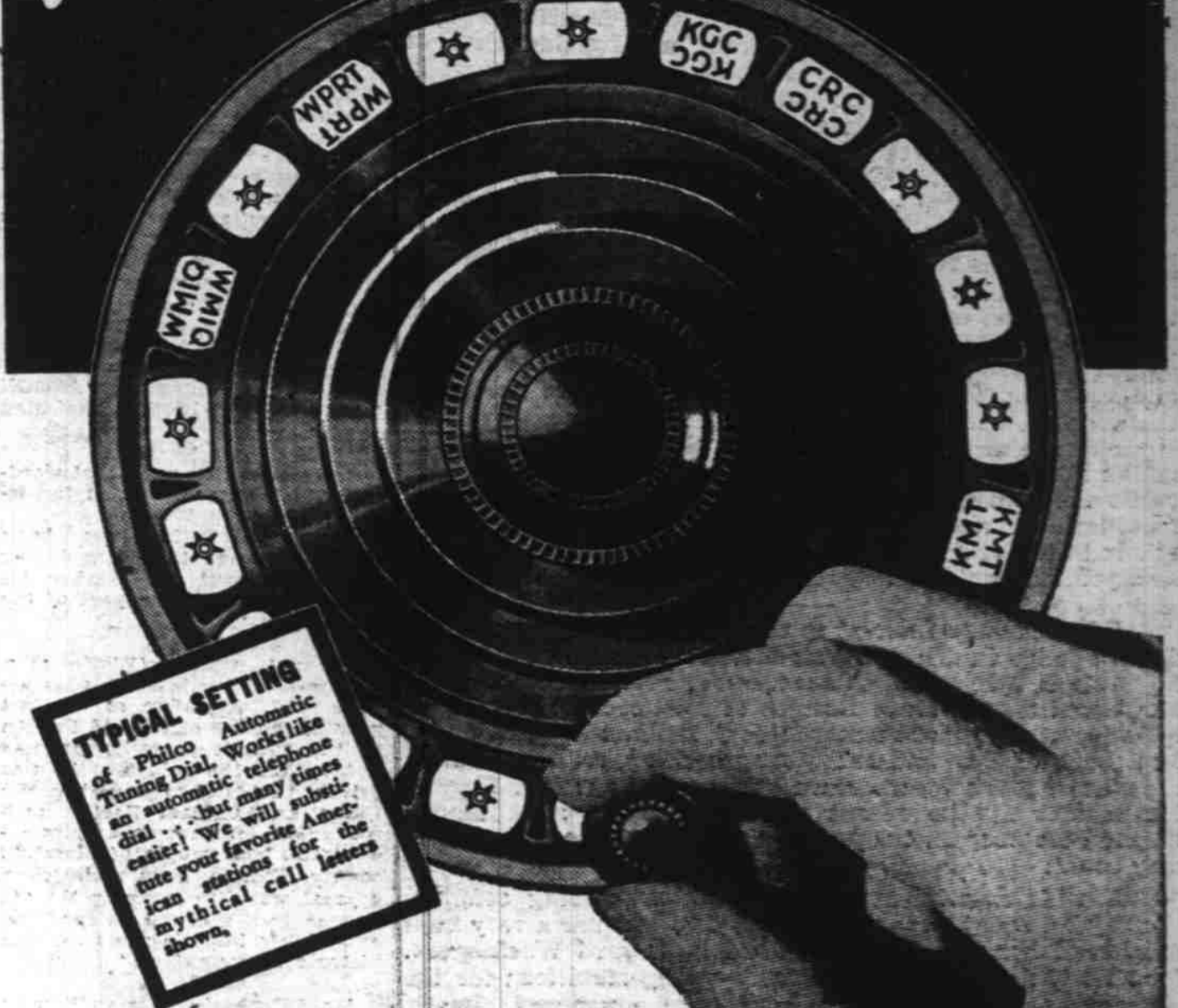
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
