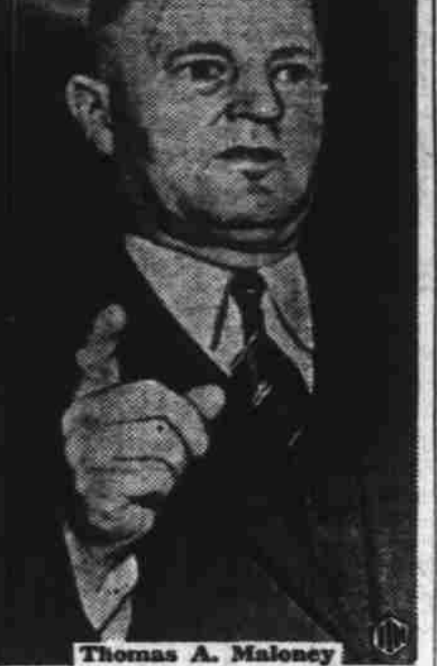
Final Rites Are Held For Mary Alice Houser, Resident North Howell
