# **Tuberculosis Test** Work Is Outlined

Situation in County Told at Lions Meeting by County Leader

Why tolerate the continuing ravages of tuberculosis when all cases of the disease could easily be discovered and in most cases cures effected? This question in effect was put to the Salem Lions club Thursday noon by Mrs. George R. K. Moorhead, executive secretary of the Marion County Public Health association in an address on "Tuberculosis in Salem and Marion County."

"If we had as many cases of smallpox in Salem as we have of tuberculosis, everybody would be up in arms," Mrs. Moorhead declared. "Since we know how to stamp out tuberculosis and have the means to do it, we are very negligent in not doing so."

Throughout the United States, the speaker pointed out, 21/2 times as many people die from tuberculosis as from automobile accident injuries, or about 89,000 a year. And the tuberculosis victims, she said, are usually "young people, in the prime of life."

Seals Pay for Tests Expanding its program, the county public health association has made it possible through Christmas seal sales this year to offer every school child in the county an opportunity to submit to the simple tuberculin test which proves conclusively whether the person tested has ever been exposed and infected in any degree with tuberculosis More than 3000 such tests have been administered in the county's schools since January 1.

Positive reactions, evidencing possibility that the child may have an active case of tuberculosis are found in 7.2 pct, of the 1671 Salem school children tested since January 1, Mrs. Moorhead told the club men. The 7.2 per cent represented 120 families. These positive reactors are being whether or not they have active cases of the disease.

The average of positive-reacting students in Salem high school was found to be 11.5 per cent among boys and 9 per cent among girls, in the junior high schools, 12.7 per cent and in the grade schools 3.3 per cent.
