Breakfast Toast Dressed Up For Interest

A chapter on toast in one of my favorite cookbooks gives many ideas for breakfast and quick supper dishes.

BAKED TOAST 3 eggs, 3 cups milk, 6 slices stale bread, few grains salt. Beat eggs and milk, add salt. Dip each slice of bread in the beaten mixture and place in a well buttered dish.

MAPLE SUGAR TOAST Remove crusts from thin slices of bread, toast and spread lightly with butter and soft maple sugar.

Today's Menu

A jellied salad begins this meal, and a date whip ends it. Here is a suggested menu:

Jellied vegetable salad, Blanquette of veal, Fresh peas, buttered, Date whip, Cookies.

BLANQUETTE OF VEAL Have two pounds breast of veal cut in cubes, put in a saucepan with water or stock, boil and skim.

In milling rolled oats, one western miller uses 9 distinct cleaning and processing operations.

A menu to serve on Sunday includes: Endive salad, Veal stew with noodles, Cauliflower fritters, Fresh rhubarb pie ala mode.

Soup Makes Almost Whole Meal

Many meal planners neglect soup as a regular member of the menu when it's a possibility for almost the whole lunch or late supper.

MONGOLE SOUP Use equal proportions of tomato puree, and puree of peas. Add as a garnish carrots, turnips and leeks cut in Juliennes (shredded on the medium shredder or sliced very fine) that have been boiled in salted water.

For delicious orange biscuits top each round of dough with a piece of cube sugar that has been dipped in orange juice.
