

# Salem High Chances in State Meet Dimmed; High Jumper Out

## Prelims to Be Today, Eugene

Grabhorst, Best Viking Prospect, Unable to Participate, Word

Salem high's chances of coming out high in the finals of the annual state high school track meet, preliminary of which will be held today at Eugene, hit the to-boggan yesterday when it was learned that Richard Grabhorst, Viking high-jumper, will be unable to compete in the state meet because of illness.

Coach Vern Gilmore announced last night that Grabhorst, who qualified for the state meet with a leap of 5 feet, 2 inches at the district meet last week, is out of the state meet by doctor's orders. He has been confined to bed all this week, Gilmore stated.

Gilmore said that loss of Grabhorst meant a loss of three and possibly five points to the Salem team. Grabhorst has several times topped six feet in practice and Gilmore felt that he would exceed his usual marks in state competition.

Grabhorst, who qualified for the state meet for the first time this year, is a senior.

The seven other Salem entrants will leave for Eugene this morning to go through qualifying rounds. Competitors in every event except the mile run must go through the qualifying heats.
