Albrecht Granted Divorce to Claim Hungary's Throne

BUDAPEST, June 3—(AP)—An ancient royal court today smoothed the way for the Hapsburg Archduke Albrecht to press his claims to the vacant Hungarian throne without the encumbrance of a commoner wife.

The court, revived from pre-war practices by Regent Nicolas Horthy, granted the archduke a civil divorce from his wealthy beautiful wife, Irene Lebach, whom he married secretly in England in 1936.

Called "Europe's most difficult divorce case," Albrecht and his wife had sought legal separation for several years but ordinary courts were considered without jurisdiction because of the archduke's exalted status.

The divorce was only civil and the attitude of the Catholic church, which granted a special dispensation recognizing the marriage three years after it was performed, remained uncertain.
