Non-High School Job not Sought

DALLAS, June 11.—No candidate has yet filed for the position of school director from zone No. 1 in the Polk county non-high school district. This district includes Zena, West Salem, Brush College, Mountain View, Spring Valley, Popcorn and Lincoln. W. Frank Crawford is the present director.

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The election of the director is held at the same time the regular annual school election is held in each of these districts. The qualifications are that the candidate must be a taxpayer and be from zone No. 1.
In the Dallas district, No. 2, there are two directors to be selected, one for a three-year term and one for a one-year term. So far only one candidate, A. R. Hartman, has filed for school director. Hartman at present is serving out the unexpired term of the late Dr. L. A. Bollman. Laird Woods, whose term expires

this year, has declined to run for another term.
