Sell Last Assets Of Hubbard Bank

Windup of Liquidation Is
Near; Orders Approved
by Circuit Court

Liquidation orders affecting defunct financial institutions at Aurora, Hubbard, Scotts Mills and Dayton were signed by Circuit Judge L. G. Lewelling yesterday. The state banking department was authorized to sell to Childs & Miller, low bidders, the remaining non-cash assets of the State Bank of Hubbard for \$175.50 for commercial department assets and for \$75.50 for savings assets.

Other liquidation orders included: Bank of Dayton, sale of Mehana hotel property to J. F. and Emma Richards for \$850 approved, including a contract covering its sale to Bart and Lizzie Fitzgerald for \$909.65.

Scotts Mills bank, order to charge off overdraft of \$44.85 of Peter Olsen to loss account. On June 1 this year a compromise settlement was made with Olsen for \$1965 which was intended to cover the overdraft also but failed to include it.

Aurora State bank, mortgage of Bertha E. and J. P. Hewitt for \$410.50 allowed to go by default. Owners Loan corporation, its foreclosure for \$76,662.92 principal sum and \$352.88 taxes, and it would be to the best interests of bank depositors, says order, to allow second mortgage holder to default.

Report of receipts of disbursements of Aurora bank from December 21, 1935, to June 1, 1937, shows a balance in the commercial closing account of \$21,800.90 and the savings closing account of \$7360.71. Commercial assets as of June 30 are listed at \$91,188.98 and savings at \$36,806.26, or total of \$127,995.24.

Order by E. L. Crawford \$20 in attorney's fee was also entered against the Aurora bank.

Rental Increases Target of Board

State department heads who expend their office space at increased rental cost without first consulting the state board of control were taken to task at Monday's meeting of the board.

The discussion centered on a request from the extension department of the state board of higher education asking for another room in the Oregon building with a rental increase of from \$30 to \$104 a month. It developed during the meeting that the extension department had taken over the additional room July 1.

"I think some of our department heads take too much for granted," Governor Charles H. Martin declared.

The board voted to continue its policy of purchasing automobiles on a low bid. This was announced after Charles P. Pray, superintendent of state police, had requested the purchase of an automobile.

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Building and Site Offers Are Listed

11 Portland Structures,
20 Locations Proposed
to Control Board

Eleven Portland buildings and 20 sites upon which construction would be necessary have been offered to the state board of control in connection with the 1937 legislative act empowering that body to establish a state office building in Portland. It was made known when the list was released by the board Monday. The board has not yet considered the offers formally.

The legislative act carried no appropriation and the board members indicated that any building or site acquired would have to be paid for on a rental basis.

The buildings offered follow: Board of Trade building, 210 SW 4th street, reinforced steel and concrete construction. Eleven floors and basement, 89,312 square feet of floor space and 10,000 square feet of ground area. Price \$465,000 cash or \$3216 per month payable over a period of 15 years.

Oregon building, 6 stories and basement, \$375,000. Henry E. Reed, SE Grand and SE Taylor, 2 stories, 50x190 or three stories, 50x190. Price \$50,000, less 10 per cent for cash. Elks building, six floors and basement. Price \$690,000. Basement for 56 automobiles.
