

New Fire Pumper Arrives in Salem

"Last Word" Machine Will Replace old Chemical Acquired in 1911

Resplendent in the usual red paint and chromium fittings the Salem fire department's new 600-gallon pumper arrived yesterday and was being prepared by Seagrave company experts for its underwriters' tests next week.

The new Seagrave pumper, which will replace an old American LaFrance chemical engine bought in 1911, is what is advertised as a triple pumper. Besides having a pump of 600 gallon capacity per minute, the machine has a booster pump of 150 gallon capacity, and carries a load of regular 3 1/2-inch fire hose. It was purchased at a cost of \$7,481.25.

Until it has been given the standard underwriters' tests, including tests of pump pressure and duration tests, the engine will be stored at the East Salem fire station. When put in service it will be housed at the central fire station and will occupy the berth now held by the antediluvian chemical truck.

Trial Runs Made
Seagrave mechanics who delivered the pumper yesterday held out for trial runs and limbered up the pumping mechanism with a workout at the South Winter street crossing of the mill stream. The pump has a rated capacity of 120 pounds pressure.

The old chemical wagon, which was Salem's first piece of motorized fire apparatus, was the predecessor of a fleet of eight motorized trucks now operated by the department. It has not yet been decided what will be done with the old machine, which has practically outlived its usefulness and has become almost dangerous to operate.

Neither ship was engaged in Spanish trade. The Mongolia was en route from Genoa to New Orleans, the British Corral from the Persian gulf port of Abadan to England with a cargo of gasoline. Both were miles off the coast.

Traffic Improves At Lower Speeds

INDIANAPOLIS, Aug. 6. — (AP) — Traffic moves faster at low speeds, Police Capt. Lewis Johnson said today — and he cited figures to prove it.

"Our studies show that at 25.5 miles an hour more cars can be moved past a given point in an hour than at any other speed," he explained. "At that speed the safe distance between cars is 33 feet and 2,600 cars can be moved past a given point within an hour."

The number of cars moved decreased steadily at higher speeds because the safe distance between them increases.

GRAND COULEE, Wash., Aug. 6. — (AP) — CIO union members, scheduled to strike tomorrow morning on this huge river development project, voted tonight "to hold the strike in abeyance until Monday night."

The action, at a closed CIO meeting which packed a large hall, was unanimous save for a solitary vote.

William H. Hillyer, CIO representative, urged the local members to hold up the strike to allow the arrival of Richard Francis, of Seattle, regional CIO director, and James Molham, CIO attorney, and completion of arrangements to care for strikers.

The dam contractors ignored the request of the CIO for a reply to demands tonight and let the 7 p. m. deadline pass without communication.

istration of the program under Secretary Ickes' interior department instead of an independent agency.

The chamber also approved an amendment by Senator Tydings (D., Md.) requiring that local communities put up 5 per cent of construction costs and contribute 5 per cent of an annual subsidy.

Two forms of federal aid, loans and outright subsidies, are provided in the bill, which authorizes a \$700,000,000 bond issue in the next three years and an initial appropriation of \$26,000,000.

GRANTS PASS, Aug. 6. — (AP) — Constable Fred Houston said he had arrested William Burger, 79, to question him about the shooting today of George Bryan, 70. Bryan suffered critical shotgun wounds in his right chest.

Houston said investigating officers believed there had been a quarrel over irrigation allotments. Bryan is a plumber.

Bryan told J. E. "Cap" Verdin, Burger's neighbor, that he was in his tomato patch when he was shot, Houston related. He said the shot had been fired from a distance of ten feet.

Verdin told officers he was awakened by shouting. He ran to the Burger house where he said he found his neighbor "very nervous." Later he found Bryan sitting on the steps of another house "bleeding very badly."

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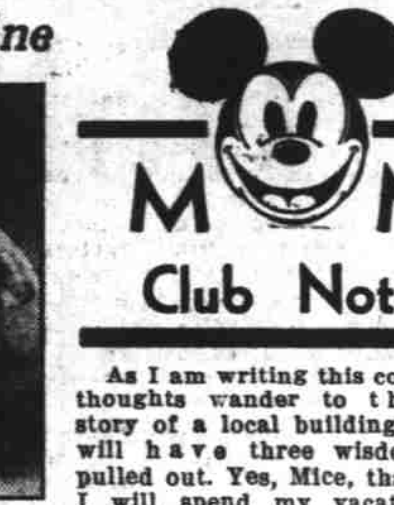
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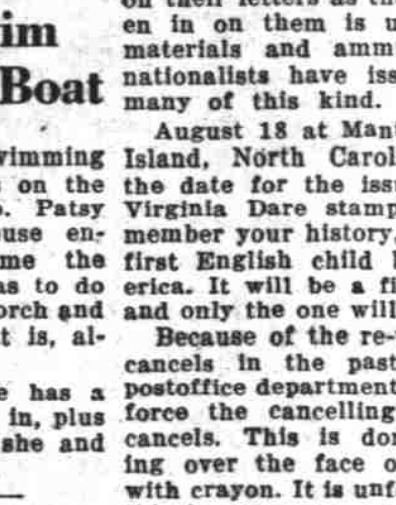
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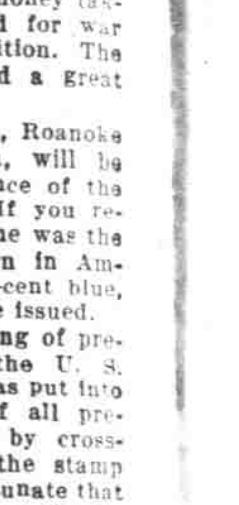
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
