PROVENCE, R. I., Aug. 12. —(AP)—In a move to prevent sale of Vermont milk in Rhode Island, the department of agriculture inspectors poured red vegetable coloring matter into approximately 5,000 quarts of milk shipped in from dairies in northern New England not licensed by this state.

This action ordered by Burton K. Harris, state director of agriculture, climaxed a campaign he has been waging for several months to persuade several Rhode Island dealers to cease using milk from Vermont, and to buy milk from Rhode Island producers, some of whom have been without a market because of a surplus production of about 5,000 quarts a day.

PORTLAND, Aug. 12 (AP)—R. E. Hickson, chief of the Portland district, United States engineers, said work would be completed this week on the 1700-foot pile tramway at the outer end of the Umpqua river south jetty.
