

Jesse E. Simpkins Funeral Is Today

Member of Pioneer Family in Oregon; Father Came in 1847

Jesse E. Simpkins, 55, youngest of a pioneer family of 15 and whose father, Hiram B. Simpkins arrived in Oregon in 1847, died at 8:15 Wednesday night in a local hospital after a lingering illness.

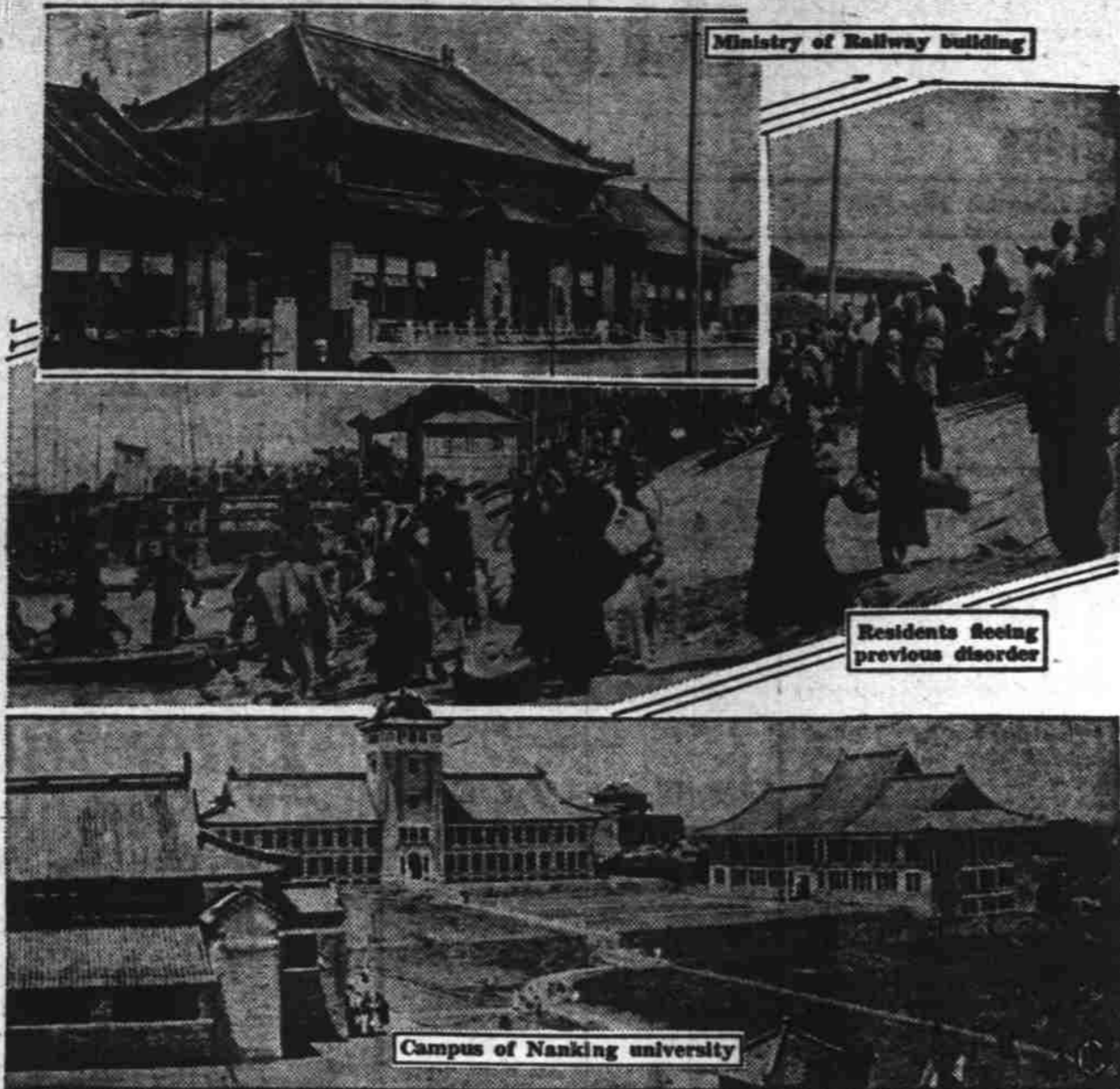
After being stricken some weeks ago he withdrew from work at the paper mill here and received care at his home at 1810 Market street and at the hospital.

His mother, Mrs. Mary Ann Gay Simpkins, was born in Oregon in the first brick house west of the Rockies. Her father, George Gay, is reported to have arrived in this section sometime before it became a territory. He, at one time, owned extensive holdings in Polk county.

Survivors include the widow Mrs. Clara Simpkins, children, Velma Deckerbach of Salem and Lorena Simpkins of Eugene, one brother, Newton Simpkins of Hopewell and sisters, Mrs. Mary Weston of Oregon City, Mrs. Al Williamson of San Francisco, Mrs. Rosa Smith of Salem, Mrs. May Versteeg of Hopewell, Mrs. Frank Charles of Oregon City and Mrs. Florence Elwood of Portland.

Memorial services will be held Friday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock from the W. T. Rigdon chapel with interment at the Hopewell cemetery. Rev. George Swift will officiate.
