

### Prune Borer Pest Control Outlined

#### Paradichlorobenzene Use Advised; Damage Done by Larval Stage

The peach and prune root borer, a destructive insect which tunnels back and forth in the cambium layer of peach and prune trees just under the ground line and causes damage in small amounts to total destruction of trees, can be controlled by carefully applying treatments of paradichlorobenzene. The favorable dates for placing the treatment in the Willamette valley are August 15 to September 15, according to County Agent Harry L. Riches.

The damage to the tree is done by the larval stage of the peach and prune root borer which is hatched from eggs laid by the adult, a clear-winged, wasp-like insect during the summer months. Paradichlorobenzene, when placed in the soil during warm dry weather when the soil temperature is about 60 degrees forms a heavier than air gas which penetrates downward. The success in killing this pest by using this gas depends largely upon the method and manner of placing the "Paradi" about the tree to prevent the escape of the gas formed from it, says the county agent.

**Distribute Evenly**

Application of  $\frac{3}{4}$  ounce to one ounce of "paradi" is used for trees six years or older. Very large trees may require larger applications.

$\frac{1}{4}$  to 2 inches from the tree trunk. Care must be used to distribute the crystals as evenly as possible, since the action of the gas is local. Use only pure paradichlorobenzene having the fineness of granulated sugar, advises Mr. Riches. After the crystals are placed around the tree, cover them with 4 to 6 inches of soil and compact with a sharp blow or two with the back of the shovel. This forms a mound which prevents the crystals from washing and serves as a container for the gas. Avoid pushing the crystals against the tree trunk with the first shoveful of soil.

Trees of six years of age may be treated with  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounces of "paradi" but the "paradi" must be kept away from the bark of the tree. The first dirt placed about the trees should be dropped so as to prevent the crystals from being pushed up against the bark. Because of the possibility of damage to the tender bark of young trees, the mounds should be torn down after 30 days. They may be left about the older trees until the following spring.

Usually treatment every two or three years when thoroughly done will keep peach and prune orchards reasonably free from root borers, says Mr. Riches.

Examination of trees should be made at this time for presence of the borers, their presence being indicated by gum and small particles of wood on the trunks or at the ground line and underneath the soil to a depth of four or five inches. Often times large trees may be found  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{3}{4}$  girdled. This is a serious injury to trees when such damage occurs.
