AURORA—The body of Mrs. Susanna Flannigan, fatally burned in a gasoline explosion in a closed car here Tuesday night, rests at the Miller mortuary waiting word from a sister in Indiana.

Mrs. Flannigan and her husband, Mike Flannigan, were employed at the Paul Singer hop yard where they arrived last Sunday. The couple had run out of gasoline in their car outside Aurora and had walked in to get a supply. H. R. New invited them to ride back in his car and Mrs. Flannigan had just entered the new machine with an open can of gasoline when the car was turned into an inferno by a cigaret lighted nearby.

It became impossible to reach the victim, although one bystander did reach her hand she pulled it away in her struggles. Dirt was thrown on the fire to

smother it but the tragedy had occurred. Mr. Flannigan was unharmed as was Bob New, who was also in the car behind the wheel.
