

Snell Emphasizes Tourist Industry

Oregon citizens should drop contentions as to whether or not efforts should be made to expand the state's population and industries long enough to take advantage of a highly profitable tourist business that is already at hand.

Secretary of State Earl Snell declared before the Salem Lions club at the Quella yesterday noon.

"The tourist business can be developed to great proportions with very little effort, and with-out any effect on population," Snell asserted. "Oregon is still the glittering paradise that attracted the covered wagon."

Secretary Snell also declared

He urged the clubmen to view politics as a "subject that has to do with our rights and privileges as citizens, our obligations to our fellow men," and held that "our government requires the active participation of all the people . . . to preserve basic liberties."

Native of State Passes at Shedd

Nevin McCormick, 66, Was Born in Section, Rites Set for Saturday

ALBANY—Nevin McCormick, 66, died at the family home in Shedd, Wednesday morning. Death was the direct result of heart trouble. Funeral services are under the direction of the Fisher funeral home, and will be held from the United Presbyterian church in Shedd, Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. E. J. Clark will preach the sermon and burial will be in the Shedd cemetery.

Nevin McCormick was born at Shedd, April 16, 1871, and had spent his entire life in this state, living at Shedd, Waterloo, Brownsville and returning to Shedd in 1936 where he spent the last year of his life on his farm west of town. Mr. McCormick was a charter member of

the United Presbyterian church of Shedd, of which he was an elder for many years. He also served as elder of the Presbyterian church of Lebanon while he made his home in that vicinity. Throughout his active life he took an active part in church work.

The early years of his life, Mr. Nevin spent on a farm, and on February 1, 1921, he was appointed a rural mail carrier out of Waterloo. In March, 1933, he was transferred to Brownsville and carried the mail through the rural communities until May 1, 1936, when he retired. He was a member of the Oregon Rural Mail Carriers' association at the time of his death.

On September 29, 1893, Mr. McCormick married May Yantis, who survives, as do three sons and two daughters. The sons are Ralph Claire McCormick of Corvallis; Robert William McCormick of Shedd, and Donald Nevin McCormick of Portland. The two daughters are Mrs. Bertha Lee Meyer of Edmonds, Wash., and Mrs. Ethel M. Blount of Portland. He is also survived by a brother, Wil-

liam B. McCormick of Shedd, two sisters, Mrs. Grace M. Coney of Shedd and Mrs. Lena M. Gibson of Albany, and six grandsons.
