

Widow Asks Delay In Mortgage Case

An attempt to forestall an impending mortgage foreclosure on ranch land near Mill City by admitting the obligation is overdue but asking as a matter of equity that an extension be granted the defendants, a widow and her six minor children, is made in an answer filed in circuit court yesterday by defense attorneys, in the case of State Land board vs. Edna M. Short and children. Payments on the \$300 mortgage, on 560 acres of mountain ranchland, were kept up until Reuben T. Short died in 1931, the answer says, and at that time the principal had been reduced to \$2600. Subsequently Edna M.

Short, the widow, sold one of the farms, 160 acres, and thereby increased the total of payments including interest to \$3264.45. With 400 acres of land left, the answer contends, the land board has sufficient security to protect its remaining mortgage claim.

An extension time of at least one year is asked because, according to the answer, the state highway department is expected to construct the new North Santiam highway across the 240-acre ranch involved and thereby enhance its value materially.

Salem Supporting Santiam Caravan

When this stretch is improved, it is held, the important cross-state route between the sea and eastern Oregon will be completed as an all-year road.
