Church Rallies To Be Sunday

Four Dallas Congregations
to Have Special Events
Honoring Day

DALLAS—Leaders in the Dallas churches are busy this week making plans for rally day which will be held Sunday, October 10 by the First Methodist, the Evangelical, the Christian and the Presbyterian Sunday schools.

Rev. J. A. Linn, Methodist pastor, reports that this week has been known as "rally week" leading up to rally day on Sunday. "Church Night" was observed Monday with Ernest Peterson, Portland, as the speaker. Sunday morning a special program will be given by members of the Sunday school and at the regular church service Rev. Walter Duff, who with Mrs. Duff recently returned from an extended visit in Ireland, will speak on "A Successful Business Man Who Failed."

Mr. and Mrs. Duff will also have charge of the evening church service.

Presbyterian Program

At the Presbyterian church for rally day and promotion Sunday, a special program will be given during the Sunday school hour by different classes in the school, according to Lloyd Whitten, superintendent. At the church service Rev. S. C. Williams, supply pastor, will speak. There will be no evening services at the church.

The Evangelical church will also observe rally day with a special program given by students from the Sunday school, says Floyd Senter, superintendent. Rev. F. A. Lenz, pastor, will speak at both the morning and evening church services.

Plan Year's Work

This past week has been known as "planning week" at the Christian church according to Virgil McPherson, superintendent, with several meetings held. As a part of the Sunday night service these plans of each department of the Sunday school will be submitted by the leaders in the four departments of the school. No special program will be given at the Sunday school hour but rally day plans call for each class to increase the attendance. This part of the program is to be extended to January 1 by which time it is hoped that each class may double its enrollment.

Rev. O. D. Harris, pastor of the church will speak both morning and evening Sunday.

Finish school and graduate

Although American colleges and universities this fall are jammed with a record enrollment of 1,250,000 students, only half of these will graduate. Because of this high mortality rate, educators are advocating some plan in place of mass education. The junior college has been suggested as a means of giving the average student two years of education, yet permitting the more ambitious scholar to go on with advanced work for two years more. In line with the shifting emphasis in educational fields, more stress is being placed on the social sciences and less importance attached to the classics. Requirements are being eliminated and the student given greater latitude in shaping his own course.
