Fire Loss Lowest Ever, Buck Avers

PORTLAND, Oct. 27—(AP)—Fire loss in the 20 national forests of Washington and Oregon for the past three years was the lowest for a like period since the forests were established in 1906, regional Forester C. J. Buck of the U.

S. forest service said today. In the period 1935-37 inclusive only 20,802 acres of a total of more than 27,000,000 acres inside the forest boundaries suffered from fires, Buck said. The lowest previous loss was 37,104 acres burned in the 1933-35 period. Buck attributed the improvement to the CCC, increased fire-consciousness on the part of the public and improved methods of fire detection and suppression.
