

### More Equipment Taken Into Mine

Stockholders Meeting for Elkhorn Company Is Next Tuesday

SCIO—Included in recent equipment at the Crown mine in the Elkhorn mining district on the Little North Fork of the Santiam river is a 32-horsepower gas tractor, to be used for driving the large compressor in the mine. The tractor will be taken to the

mine as soon as the bridge across the river is completed. R. E. Peery of Scio, manager of the mine, stated here.

Glen Charleston of the Willamette national forest recently visited the mine and checked over and mapped the survey just completed by the surveyor's office of Marion county of the road and bridge site of the mining company.

"A grade of not more than 15 per cent has been established from the national forest road to the new campsite, and work was expected to start on the new road immediately upon granting of permit by the forest service," Peery said.

Plan Development Soon after the annual meeting

of stockholders of the Crown mining company, which is called for Tuesday, November 13, it is proposed to initiate a development program for the coming winter, according to Peery.

The company's consulting engineer, J. Cleveland Haas, of Portland, who made an inspection of the property a short time ago, advises tunnel operations in addition to depth attained in the shaft, which was to be continued to the 100-foot level.
