Vigorous opposition to the pending federal wages and hours

Prohibition of political contributions by either labor unions or corporations.

Adoption of these followed a closed "labor clinic" at which Charles W. Fahy, general counsel of the national labor relations board, vigorously opposed suggested revision of the Wag-

Strife Costs 5 Billions He said later, however, that he wanted to make it plain that his attitude was "not antagonistic," but he wished to make it equally clear that no moderation of enforcement of the law was to be expected.

Previously Ernest T. Weir, chairman of the National Steel corporation, asserted labor strife had cost America five billion dollars in 1937, "the worst and most costly period of labor turmoil in our history," and declared the government's attitude was "one of the worst stumbling blocks to a rational get



Aligned in support of the plan, based on the "ever-normal" granary idea of Secretary of Agriculture Henry Wallace, is a bloc headed by Marvin Jones of

Four principal aims of the program include soil conservation, storing of surplus crops during bumper years, provision for crop loans and restoring old markets and create new ones. Although Senator Ellison D. Smith of South Carolina presented a bill in the senate on behalf of the senate agricultural committee, the house bill is more complete; and is the one backed by farm organizations, .


