Turner Eastern Star Observes Birthday

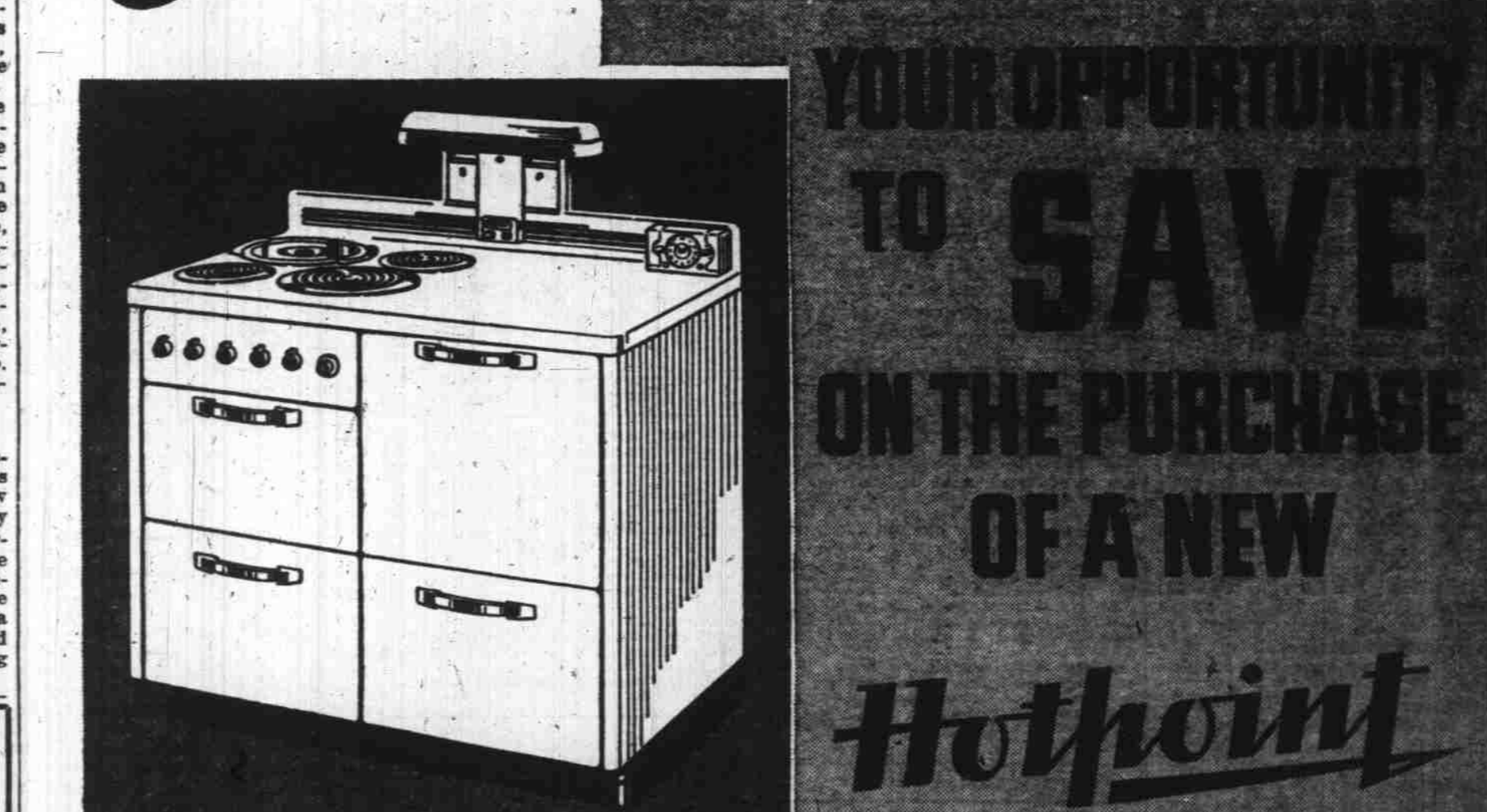
More than 70 members and visitors attended the birthday anniversary observance of Victoria chapter, Order of Eastern Star, at Turner on Wednesday April 27.

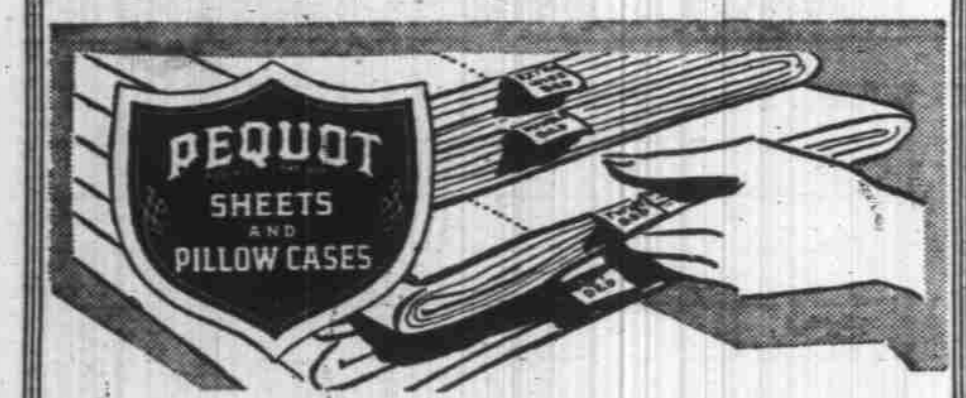
