**No More Women**



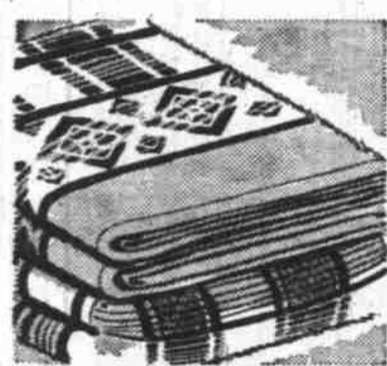

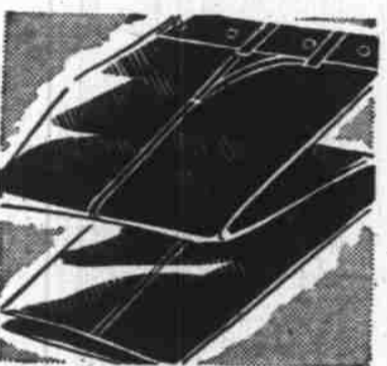
