Signs Detailed Confession of Brutal Murder of James Cash, Jr.

chief said the prisoner broke and began his detailed confession to-day after an all-night grilling.

In his summary of the confession, the full text of which was not made public, Hoover said McCall considered two other victims before settling on the Cash boy when he first decided on the kidnapping about two weeks before it was carried out May 28.

He said also the prisoner attempted to involve R. A. Cash, an uncle of the slain boy, in the crime but the G-men questioned and completely exonerated Cash.

Hoover's statement said McCall claimed he killed the child accidentally, presumably by suffocation, when he was carrying the boy from the Cash home to McCall's cottage while holding a cloth over Skeegie's mouth to prevent an outcry.

Attorneys said even if this claim of accidental killing were accepted it would not preclude a first degree murder indictment since death occurred during commission of a felony.

About 40 of the Cash clan assembled at Homestead for funeral services today, the mother weeping and the father dry-eyed but grief-bowed. The pitiful little body was brought here for burial.

"He prepared the ransom note a week before the kidnapping on May 28, and about 9:30 that night McCall entered the Cash store, asked Mrs. Cash the time, saw that both Mr. and Mrs. Cash were there," said Hoover in summarizing the confession.

Defense Demurrer Denied by Walker

Rosser and Adams to Be Tried Separately in Dallas Court

DALLAS, June 10.—Al Rosser, and Clarence Adams, labor leaders, charged jointly in an indictment with arson in connection with the West Salem box factory fire last November, will have separate trials in circuit court here.

Such a move for each defendant was requested today after the defense demurrer to the indictments against Rosser and Adams was overruled by Judge Arlie G. Walker, before whom the pair appeared this afternoon to enter pleas.

Both men pleaded not guilty to the charge. Following the legal skirmish in which the "goon" leaders lost, Judge Walker docketed Rosser's trial for Monday, June 27, a day already mentioned; and set Adams' trial for Monday, July 11.

of the allocated capital investment over a reasonable period of years.

They should, added Acting Chairman Clyde L. Seavy, enable Ross "to encourage widest possible use" of Bonneville to private purchasers for their own use, but not for resale, and to public bodies, cooperatives and privately owned electric utilities for distribution within 15 miles of the generating plant.

Transmission system rates will be available to public bodies, cooperatives and privately owned utilities for resale only.

Public Utilities Commissioner N. G. Wallace said he had no criticism of the Bonneville power rates, submitted by Administrator J. D. Ross and approved yesterday by the federal power commission.

Governor Martin said four weeks ago, when Ross announced the rates, that they were too high, asserting "I hope they will be lowered." The governor, who is on vacation, could not be reached for comment today.

Wallace estimated that the primary rate of \$17.50 per kilowatt year for transmitted primary power means that utilities and utility districts would pay five mills per kilowatt if the power is used 42

per cent of the time, as is now the case. But if the power is used 100 per cent of the time, the rate would drop to two mills.

Dodson Doesn't Like It
PORTLAND, Ore., June 10.—(AP)—W. D. B. Dodson, manager of the Portland chamber of commerce, today promised to fight "to the end of time" for reductions in Bonneville dam power rates as approved by the federal power commission.

The chamber executive, speaking for interests opposed to the approved schedules, compiled by J. D. Ross, dam administrator, criticized the commission for not permitting adequate time to consider the figures and not calling more elaborate hearings.

"We hold the rates are entirely too high on the basis of cost and are clearly out of range with the intents of the act," he said.

The Multnomah, Heathman and New Heathman hotels said they were prepared to handle laundry for other hostelrys if union drivers refused to pass picket lines. Drivers have been ordered to respect the lines.

The Multnomah served as employment headquarters for non-union workers, with more than 1000 applicants ready to fill vacant jobs.

Gunther Krause, attorney for operators, declared "The first move is up to the unions; they walked out." He indicated the move would have to involve a city-wide vote among hotel workers to determine their collective bargaining preference. Unions struck to force recognition.

The five unions involved were confident that cooperation of other AFL groups would force employers to give in.

You'd told how he drove a team of horses to the shattered bomber. He added:

"One man, wearing a parachute, was still in the wreckage. Other bodies in uniforms, badly mangled, were scattered all over. All had parachutes attached to their backs. Two or three of these 'chutes were opened but charred and burned. It appeared that these men had leaped trying to save themselves and the 'chute caught fire as they left the ship."

Sewer Project Wins Approval

Approval of \$21,800 WPA Project Given for Capitol Sewers

Construction of the Court street sewer is necessary before the state capitol reconstruction commission and highway commission can proceed with altering and repaving the Court street approaches to the new capitol. The sewer will extend from 18th street to Church where it will connect with a 48-inch trunk sewer.

As set up here the sanitary sewer project will cost the city \$17,882 and the WPA \$21,876. In addition to the Court street job it will provide new sewers along 15th street from Trade to Bellevue and along Liberty from Oak to Leslie.

WPA officials predicted yesterday that they would receive an allotment of funds within 10 days

for the storm sewer project, which calls for major improvements throughout the city. This project will cost \$82,962, of which the city will bear \$33,562 and the WPA \$50,400.
