Barbara's Son
Is Court Ward

Count Haugwitz-Reventlow
on Way to London to
Answer Summons

LONDON, June 30.—(P)—The infant son and heir of the squabbling Haugwitz-Reventlows was reported tonight to have been made a ward in chancery by his mother as his father traveled to London to face a Bow street police court summons.

Two-year-old Lance Haugwitz-Reventlow, under the reported move, would be under control of the court until he reaches 21. Neither his father, Count Count Haugwitz-Reventlow, nor his mother, Countess Barbara, American born, Woolworth heiress, could make a ruling affecting him without the sanction of the court.

The application to place the child in custody of the court was said to have been made today before a master in chambers by Countess Barbara's costly counsel, Sir Patrick Hastings.

The count, determined to bring the case to a climax by facing charges of his wife that he had made threats involving their son, left Paris for London.

Count Faces Charges
In dingy Bow street court the immaculate count is to reply to the charges that he threatened his wife—charges which resulted in locked gates and a day and night guard around her magnificent new London town house.

Her motive in moving to place Lance under court supervision presumably was to remove any possibility of the father's gaining custody of the child. The couple reportedly had quarreled about plans for his upbringing and now are considering getting a divorce in Danish courts. Both a Dange, the countess having surrendered her American nationality.

As a ward in chancery, Lance's education would be directed by the court. His nationality would not be affected. Because he was born in London he is considered British.

All signs were interpreted tonight as pointing toward further legal action for the romance of three years' standing.

FDR Condemns
Book Burning

Tells Educators Exiling
of Scientists Hamper
for Civilization

NEW YORK, June 30.—(P)—President Roosevelt condemned the burning of libraries, the exiling of scientists, writers and musicians and the censoring of news, literature and art in an address today to members of the National Education association at the World's fair site.

Without naming any country, he said such things turn back "the clock of civilization."

"If the first of freedom and civil liberties burn low in other lands," he said, "they must be made brighter in our own."

"If in other lands the press is censored, we must redouble our efforts to keep it free."

Truth Safeguard Asked
"If in other lands the eternal truths of the last are threatened by intolerance, we must provide a safe place here for other perpetuation."

"There may be times when men and women in the turmoil of change lose touch with the civilized gains of centuries of education," the president continued, "but the gains of education are never really lost."

Earlier, the president made a new declaration against war and reiterated the policy of the good neighbor as a model for the rest of the world in helping lay the cornerstone of the fair's \$3,000,000 federal project.

"The only real capital of a nation is its natural resources and its human beings. So long as we take care of and make the most of both of them, we shall survive as a strong nation, a successful nation and a progressive nation—whether or not the bookkeepers say other kinds of budgets are from time to time out of balance."
