### Single Log Seen At Scio Will Cut About 7000 Feet

SCIO—Another "Oregon toothpick" was photographed on a heavy logging truck on Main street in Scio a few days ago. The "sapling" came from the forest foothills east of Scio and was being taken to Dallas for manufacture into lumber. The log was 32 feet in length and measured 65 inches in diameter at the smaller end. It would yield approximately 7000 feet of lumber or eight cords of fuel wood, experienced timber men estimated. Thousands of such logs have been trucked through Scio this summer.
