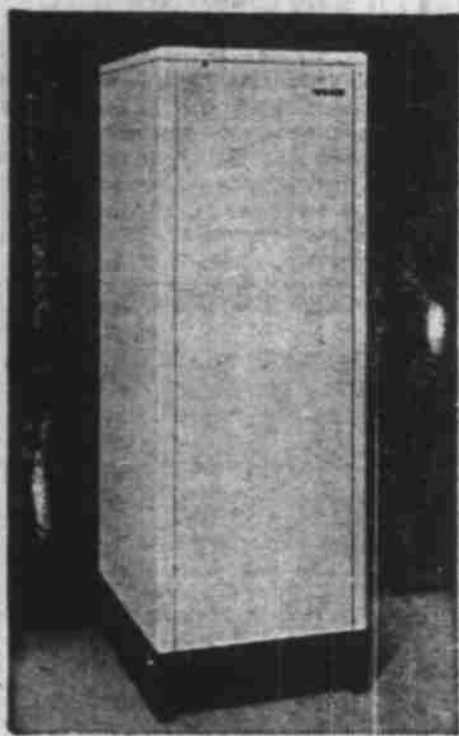

## Redheads Capture Taft for Festival

Lincoln County Celebration to Commence Saturday for two Days

TAFT, Aug. 4.—A vanguard of "Reds" descended on Taft today and after taking possession of the city, declared that a huge "Red army" would reach here Saturday and Sunday.

The Redhead Roundup is without doubt, America's most unusual celebration and so far as known, is the only civic festival of its kind in the world.

Thousands of "carrot tops" and other visitors pour into this little north Lincoln county beach resort each year at roundup time.

Red hair is a season pass to the roundup shows and every "brick topped" visitor is presented with a beautiful polished agate.

Cherrians in Coronation  
A wide variety of interesting events are included in the Redhead Roundup program this year, all designed to place redheads in the spotlight.

On Saturday, August 6, the opening day of the roundup, the titian queen will be crowned in an elaborate coronation conducted by the Salem Cherrians of which "Eric, the Red" King of the roundup, in private life, "Brick" Headrick of Salem, is a member of the Council of Nobles. Redhead contests and a musical program by redheaded artists will follow the coronation.

## Kilties Presenting Concert Saturday

Chief Nimmo and his Kilties will appear at the First Christian church for a concert tomorrow night at 8 o'clock. The Kilties now on their third annual tour of the United States and Canada are the only group now touring which wear Highland costumes.

The Kilties have appeared here twice before. There is no admission charge but an offering will be taken.

This group of artists was organized by Chief William L. Nimmo, a Scotch-Canadian. The chief is also the organizer and president of the Cincinnati Caledonia bagpipe band and is an honorary member of the Cincinnati Caledonian society. Chief Nimmo is well known throughout the United States for his musical endeavors along Scotch lines. Mr. Nimmo is the director, bass and bagpiper of the Kilties quartet.

## Probe Sabotage



Wah Sun Choy, Chinese patriot and New Jersey restaurant owner, who was aboard the Hawaii Clipper, which recently vanished in mid-Pacific. Choy, en route to Hong Kong, was reported to have been carrying a large sum of money to aid the Chinese cause in the current Sino-Japanese conflict. No trace of the missing flying boat has been found except a film of gasoline and oil floating on the surface of the ocean near where the Clipper last reported. No bits of wreckage or traces of the silver fuselage were evident. Possibility of sabotage was included in the elements the government is investigating in connection with the Clipper's mysterious disappearance.

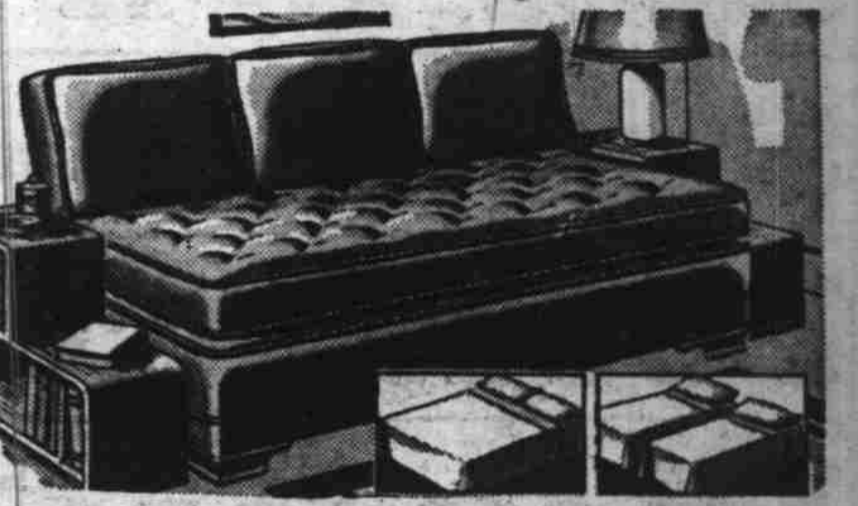
