Flax Festival Opens Today

Cherrians to Crown Queen

At Ceremony Tonight at 8; Portland Chamber Is Sending Group

MT. ANGEL—The third annual Oregon Flax Festival will get under way here Friday. Colorful decorations greet the eye on every side in the downtown section of the city, and the populace is eagerly awaiting the thousands of visitors expected. Festivities will begin at noon when a caravan of members of the Portland chamber of commerce arrive to be feted at a luncheon at the Mt. Angel hotel. They will be met at the outskirts of Mt. Angel by official escorts. Mayor Jacob Berchtold will welcome them and speakers from both Portland and Mt. Angel will give short talks. Local artists will present a musical program. Joseph Keber, president of the Festival association, will be chairman of the day, and Dr. A. F. E. Schierbaum will be toastmaster.

In the afternoon the Portland delegation and other visitors will be taken to the flax fields and plant by special cars, provided for the occasion, and will have an opportunity to view each successive operation in the manufacture of linen fibre. Experts will explain harvesting methods and the various processes through which the flax must go before it can be woven into linen.

Open House at Co-op
Later the Mt. Angel Cooperative creamery, the largest plant of its kind in the state, will have open house for the visitors. Frank Hettwer, manager, will be host and serve the guests with ice cream, milk, buttermilk.

The Rose City group will remain to attend the queen coronation ceremonies at 8 o'clock Friday night when King Bing Tom Hill, assisted by his fellow Cherrians, will crown Queen Maxine of Flaxaria. The ceremony will take place on the steps of St. Mary's school. The queen's ball will follow at 9 p. m. Simultaneously an old time dance will be held in the new gymnasium, with juke furnished by the Crystal Gardens old time dance orchestra of Salem. Carnival features are provided. Saturday Governor Martin will be Mt. Angel's guest of honor and give the main address at the speaking program that will fol-
